mischief-making Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in

others.

mischievousness The trait of behaving like an imp.

naughtiness An attribute of mischievous children.

**perfidy**The state of being deceitful and untrustworthy.

rascality Mischievous or dishonest behaviour or activity.
