- Shine with a weak or fitful light.
- Shine with a soft, slightly wavering light.





#### Synonyms of "Shimmer" as a verb (16 Words)

Move in a pattern usually to musical accompaniment do or perform a dance. dance

glint Be shiny, as if wet.

Her glasses glinted in the firelight.

glisten (of something wet or greasy) shine with a sparkling light.

His cheeks **glisten**ed with tears.

(of eyes) shine with a particular emotion.

The grass **glitter**ed with dew.

Be exuberant or high-spirited.

Make the people s hearts **glow**.

scintillate Give off.

A zinc sulphide screen  ${\it scintillate}{\it d}$  when it was struck by an alpha particle.

Shine brightly with flashes of light.

sparkle

After a glass of wine she began to **sparkle**.

twinkle Emit or reflect light in a flickering manner.

The smile made her face crease and her eyes **twinkle**.

wink Signal by winking.

She **wink**ed at him.

Have an intense colour and a slight shine.

The coals were **glow**ing in the dark.

illumine Make lighter or brighter.

He moved her lamp so that her face was **illumine**d.

**iridescent**Varying in color when seen in different lights or from different angles.

A dragonfly hovered vibrating and **iridescent**.

Become lighter.

Try to **lighten** up and think positive.

**limelight** A focus of public attention.

The shock win has thrust him into the **limelight**.

lucent Softly bright or radiant.

The **lucent** moon.

**luminescence** Light not due to incandescence; occurs at low temperatures.

Honey fungus produces a ghostly greenish **luminescence**.

mirage An unrealistic hope or wish that cannot be achieved.

The surface of the road ahead rippled in the heat **mirage**s.

**opalescence**The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of

colors from the surface.

Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of

phosphorescent phosphorous.

The **phosphorescent** glow of decaying wood.

rainbow

An arch of colours visible in the sky caused by the refraction and
