- aghast Filled with horror or shock.
- She winced **aghast** at his cruelty.
- **appalled** Greatly dismayed or horrified.
- *appalled* I am absolutely **appalled** that anyone should be attacked in this manner.
- **<u>dismayed</u>** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.





Associations of "Shocked" (30 Words)

abominable	Very bad; terrible. <i>Abominable</i> treatment of prisoners.
<u>afraid</u>	Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened. Suddenly looked afraid .
aghast	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. She winced aghast at his cruelty.
<u>alarmed</u>	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
<u>amaze</u>	Affect with wonder. He has been amaze d by the quality of the employees at the bank.
amazed	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>He was amazed at how modern everything was.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. You never fail to astonish me.



<u>astonished</u>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. I stood enthralled astonished by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.
<u>astounding</u>	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder. The summit offers astounding views.
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone. <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
<u>bemused</u>	Puzzled, confused, or bewildered. As distant and bemused as a professor listening to the prattling of his freshman class.
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. A confused set of instructions.
<u>dismayed</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
fearful	Feeling or showing fear or anxiety. They are fearful of the threat of nuclear war.
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear. The challenge was formidable .
perplexed	Completely baffled; very puzzled. Perplexed language.
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. The questioners were met with puzzled looks.
quizzical	(of a person's expression or behaviour) indicating mild or amused puzzlement. <i>He had a quizzical expression.</i>
	Inspiring fear- G.H.Johnston. A tougher and more redoubtable adversary than the heel clicking jackbooted fanatic.
<u>revitalize</u>	Imbue (something) with new life and vitality. This food revitalize d the patient.
scared	Fearful; frightened. I m scared stiff of flying.
<u>shattered</u>	Ruined or disrupted. Our shattered dreams of peace and prosperity.



<u>shocking</u>	Very bad. The most shocking book of its time.
<u>skittish</u>	(of an animal, especially a horse) nervous or excitable; easily scared. <i>Skittish</i> investors withdrew their money from equity markets.
<u>startled</u>	Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm. Students startled by the teacher s quiet return.
surprise	Cause to be surprised. The news really surprise d me.
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. <i>Surprised</i> by her student s ingenuity.
wondering	Characterized by or expressive of admiration and amazement. Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a wondering look.
