- aghast** Filled with horror or shock.  
*She winced **aghast** at his cruelty.*
- appalled** Greatly dismayed or horrified.  
*I am absolutely **appalled** that anyone should be attacked in this manner.*
- dismayed** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.

<b>abominable</b>	Very bad; terrible. <i><b>Abominable</b> treatment of prisoners.</i>
<b>afraid</b>	Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened. <i>Suddenly looked <b>afraid</b>.</i>
<b>aghast</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. <i>She winced <b>aghast</b> at his cruelty.</i>
<b>alarmed</b>	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
<b>amaze</b>	Affect with wonder. <i>He has been <b>amazed</b> by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
<b>amazed</b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>He was <b>amazed</b> at how modern everything was.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to <b>astonish</b> me.</i>

<b><u>astonished</u></b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>I stood enthralled <b>astonished</b> by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.</i>
<b>astounded</b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i><b>Astounded</b> viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<b><u>astounding</u></b>	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b><u>bemused</u></b>	Puzzled, confused, or bewildered. <i>As distant and <b>bemused</b> as a professor listening to the prattling of his freshman class.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A <b>confused</b> set of instructions.</i>
<b><u>dismayed</u></b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b>fearful</b>	Feeling or showing fear or anxiety. <i>They are <b>fearful</b> of the threat of nuclear war.</i>
<b><u>flabbergasted</u></b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The <b>flabbergasted</b> aldermen were speechless.</i>
<b><u>formidable</u></b>	Inspiring fear. <i>The challenge was <b>formidable</b>.</i>
<b><u>perplexed</u></b>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i><b>Perplexed</b> language.</i>
<b><u>puzzled</u></b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>The questioners were met with <b>puzzled</b> looks.</i>
<b>quizzical</b>	(of a person's expression or behaviour) indicating mild or amused puzzlement. <i>He had a <b>quizzical</b> expression.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	Inspiring fear- G.H. Johnston. <i>A tougher and more <b>redoubtable</b> adversary than the heel clicking jackbooted fanatic.</i>
<b><u>revitalize</u></b>	Imbue (something) with new life and vitality. <i>This food <b>revitalized</b> the patient.</i>
<b>scared</b>	Fearful; frightened. <i>I m <b>scared</b> stiff of flying.</i>
<b><u>shattered</u></b>	Ruined or disrupted. <i>Our <b>shattered</b> dreams of peace and prosperity.</i>

<b>shocking</b>	Very bad. <i>The most <b>shocking</b> book of its time.</i>
<b>skittish</b>	(of an animal, especially a horse) nervous or excitable; easily scared. <i><b>Skittish</b> investors withdrew their money from equity markets.</i>
<b>startled</b>	Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm. <i>Students <b>startled</b> by the teacher's quiet return.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i>The news really <b>surprised</b> me.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Feeling or showing surprise. <i><b>Surprised</b> by her student's ingenuity.</i>
<b>wondering</b>	Characterized by or expressive of admiration and amazement. <i>Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a <b>wondering</b> look.</i>
