- aghast** Filled with horror or shock.
*She winced **aghast** at his cruelty.*
- appalled** Greatly dismayed or horrified.
*I am absolutely **appalled** that anyone should be attacked in this manner.*
- dismayed** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.

abominable	Very bad; terrible. <i>Abominable treatment of prisoners.</i>
afraid	Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened. <i>Suddenly looked afraid.</i>
aghast	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. <i>She winced aghast at his cruelty.</i>
alarmed	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
amaze	Affect with wonder. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
amazed	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>He was amazed at how modern everything was.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>

<u>astonished</u>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>I stood enthralled astonished by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.</i>
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
<u>bemused</u>	Puzzled, confused, or bewildered. <i>As distant and bemused as a professor listening to the prattling of his freshman class.</i>
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A confused set of instructions.</i>
<u>dismayed</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
fearful	Feeling or showing fear or anxiety. <i>They are fearful of the threat of nuclear war.</i>
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.</i>
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear. <i>The challenge was formidable.</i>
<u>perplexed</u>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i>Perplexed language.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>The questioners were met with puzzled looks.</i>
quizzical	(of a person's expression or behaviour) indicating mild or amused puzzlement. <i>He had a quizzical expression.</i>
redoubtable	Inspiring fear- G.H. Johnston. <i>A tougher and more redoubtable adversary than the heel clicking jackbooted fanatic.</i>
<u>revitalize</u>	Imbue (something) with new life and vitality. <i>This food revitalized the patient.</i>
scared	Fearful; frightened. <i>I m scared stiff of flying.</i>
<u>shattered</u>	Ruined or disrupted. <i>Our shattered dreams of peace and prosperity.</i>

<u>shocking</u>	Very bad. <i>The most shocking book of its time.</i>
<u>skittish</u>	(of an animal, especially a horse) nervous or excitable; easily scared. Skittish investors withdrew their money from equity markets.
<u>startled</u>	Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm. <i>Students startled by the teacher's quiet return.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>The news really surprised me.</i>
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. Surprised by her student's ingenuity.
<u>wondering</u>	Characterized by or expressive of admiration and amazement. <i>Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a wondering look.</i>
