<b>amazing</b>	Causing great surprise or wonder; astonishing. <i>New York is an <b>amazing</b> city.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It <b>astonished</b> her that he was so anxious.</i>

<b>awesome</b>	Extremely good; excellent. <i>My yearly review went <b>awesome</b>.</i>
<b>disturbing</b>	Causing anxiety; worrying. <i><b>Disturbing</b> unemployment figures.</i>
<a href="#"><u>flabbergasted</u></a>	Greatly surprised or astonished. <i>This news has left me totally <b>flabbergasted</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>haunting</u></a>	The action of haunting a place. <i>The cathedral organ and the distant voices have a <b>haunting</b> beauty.</i>
<a href="#"><u>impressive</u></a>	Making a strong or vivid impression. <i>Gave an <b>impressive</b> performance as Othello.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>The noise from the crowd was <b>incredible</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>marvelous</u></a>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<a href="#"><u>outrageous</u></a>	Greatly exceeding bounds of reason or moderation. <i>Her <b>outrageous</b> leotards and sexy routines.</i>

<b>prodigious</b>	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>The young Mozart s <b>prodigious</b> talents.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>She looked <b>puzzled</b> and angry with him.</i>
<b>raunchy</b>	Shabby or grubby. <i>His <b>raunchy</b> new novel.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	Worthy of respect or honor. <i>The <b>redoubtable</b> ladies.</i>
<b>revelation</b>	The last book of the New Testament recounting a divine revelation of the future to St John. <i>An attempt to reconcile Darwinian theories with biblical <b>revelation</b>.</i>
<b>saintliness</b>	The quality of resembling a saint. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on <b>saintliness</b>.</i>
<b>sensational</b>	Causing intense interest, curiosity, or emotion. <i>A <b>sensational</b> murder trial.</i>
<b>shattering</b>	Very shocking or upsetting. <i>The <b>shattering</b> tones of the enormous carillon.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Collect or gather into shocks. <i>He <b>shocked</b> so easily.</i>
<b>spectacular</b>	Beautiful in a dramatic and eye-catching way. <i>A <b>spectacular</b> rise in prices.</i>
<b>staggering</b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The amount of money required was <b>staggering</b>.</i>
<b>startling</b>	Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i>He bore a <b>startling</b> likeness to their father.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i>There was a <b>surprised</b> silence.</i>
<b>surprising</b>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>Leaped up with <b>surprising</b> agility.</i>
<b>unexpectedly</b>	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>Tourist chiefs reported <b>unexpectedly</b> high visitor numbers.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round.</i>
<b>wondering</b>	Characterized by or expressive of a desire to know something; curious. <i>Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a <b>wondering</b> look.</i>
