Associations of "Shoot yourself in the foot" (30 Words)

<u>ammunition</u>	A supply or quantity of bullets and shells. <i>Guns ammunition and explosives.</i>
breech	Dress a boy in breeches after he had been in petticoats since birth. <i>Breech presentation occurs in up to 3 per cent of pregnancies at term.</i>
<u>bullet</u>	A pitch thrown with maximum velocity. <i>Your record s bad but it s doubtful they ll give you the bullet.</i>
caliber	Diameter of a tube or gun barrel. <i>An executive of low caliber.</i>
cannon	Fire a cannon. <i>His shot cannoned off the crossbar.</i>
cartridge	Ammunition consisting of a cylindrical casing containing an explosive charge and a bullet; fired from a rifle or handgun. <i>He loaded a cartridge of fresh tape into the tape deck.</i>
catapult	Shoot forth or launch as if from a catapult. <i>The enemy catapulted rocks towards the fort.</i>
firearm	A portable gun. <i>Jones pleaded guilty to possessing a firearm with criminal intent.</i>
firing	The act of firing weapons or artillery at an enemy. <i>The colours had suffered in the firing and were dull from overheating.</i>
foam	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>A beer with a thick head of foam.</i>
fusillade	Attack with fusillade. <i>The Mahdi s adherents fusilladed his palace at Khartoum.</i>
grenade	A glass receptacle containing chemicals which are released when the receptacle is thrown and broken, used for testing drains and extinguishing fires.

gun	Used as a nickname for a ship's gunnery officer. <i>It's encouraging to note that Schwarzenegger wasn't born with massive guns.</i>
gunshot	The range of a gun. <i>We bore down and came nearly within gunshot.</i>
hammock	A hanging bed of canvas or rope netting (usually suspended between two trees); swings easily.
ignition	The mechanism for bringing about ignition in an internal combustion engine typically activated by a key or switch. <i>A small amount of diesel fuel must be injected to allow ignition.</i>
misfire	(especially of a plan) fail to produce the intended result. <i>The guns misfired.</i>
musket	A muzzle-loading shoulder gun with a long barrel; formerly used by infantrymen. <i>A volley of musket fire.</i>
muzzle	Fit with a muzzle. <i>Muzzle the dog to prevent it from biting strangers.</i>
paw	Scrape with the paws. <i>Some overweight Casanova had tried to paw her.</i>
pistol	Shoot someone with a pistol. <i>When we first met he was a pistol full of ideals and a natural leader.</i>
revolver	A door consisting of four orthogonal partitions that rotate about a central pivot; a door designed to equalize the air pressure in tall buildings.
rifle	Troops armed with rifles. <i>He lifted the rifle to his shoulder and fired.</i>
salvo	A simultaneous discharge of artillery or other guns in a battle. <i>A deafening salvo of shots rang out.</i>
shooting	The action or practice of shooting with a gun. <i>The events that led up to the shooting of the man.</i>
shot	A heavy ball thrown by a shot putter. <i>Chatoyant or shot silk.</i>
shotgun	Shoot at or kill with a shotgun. <i>I took the shotgun seat.</i>
sling	Hoist or transfer something with a sling. <i>700 men armed only with slings.</i>
toe	Touch with the toe. <i>Socks that were holed at the toes.</i>

webbed (of a band or strip of tough material) made from webbing or similar fabric.
*A heavy **webbed** strap.*
