### **Definitions of "Shorn" as an adjective**

- *Having the hair or wool cut or clipped off as if with shears or clippers.*



### **Synonyms of "Shorn" as an adjective (1 Word)**

(used especially of fur or wool) shaped or finished by cutting or trimming to a **sheared** uniform length.

*Naked as a **sheared** sheep.*

## Associations of "Shorn" (30 Words)

- barbershop** A shop where a barber works.  
*A **barbershop** quartet.*
- beard** Go along the rim like a beard around the chin.  
*He had a black **beard**.*
- clip** Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips.  
*He gave me a **clip** on the ear.*
- clipping** The act of clipping or snipping.  
*Press **clippings**.*
- cutting** The action of cutting something.  
*The **cutting** of the cake.*
- ewe** A female sheep.
- fleece** Cover as if with a fleece.  
*The sky was half blue half **fleece**d with white clouds.*

<b>fringe</b>	Decorate with or as if with a surrounding fringe. <i>A rich robe of gold <b>fringed</b> with black velvet.</i>
<b>fur</b>	A garment made of animal pelts or synthetic fur. <i>I d just seen her sitting in her <b>furs</b>.</i>
<b>fuzzy</b>	Relating to a form of set theory and logic in which predicates may have degrees of applicability, rather than simply being true or false. It has important uses in artificial intelligence and the design of control systems. <i>The picture is very <b>fuzzy</b>.</i>
<b>hackles</b>	A feeling of anger and animosity. <i>Having one s <b>hackles</b> or dander up.</i>
<b>haircut</b>	A reduction in the stated value of an asset. <i>The banks would probably be willing to take a <b>haircut</b> on the rest.</i>
<b>hairdressing</b>	Care for the hair: the activity of washing or cutting or curling or arranging the hair. <i>Courses in beauty and <b>hairdressing</b>.</i>
<b>haired</b>	Having hair of a specified kind. <i>Short <b>haired</b> cats.</i>
<b>hairy</b>	Having a rough feel or appearance suggestive of coarse hair. <i>We drove up yet another <b>hairy</b> mountain road.</i>
<b>martin</b>	French bishop who is a patron saint of France (died in 397).
<b>mohair</b>	A yarn or fabric made from mohair typically mixed with wool. <i>A <b>mohair</b> sweater.</i>
<b>molt</b>	Cast off hair, skin, horn, or feathers.
<b>mustache</b>	An unshaved growth of hair on the upper lip. <i>He looked younger after he shaved off his <b>mustache</b>.</i>
<b>otter</b>	The fur of an otter.
<b>pare</b>	Cut small bits or pare shavings from. <i>Union leaders publicly <b>pared</b> down their demands.</i>
<b>plush</b>	A fabric with a nap that is longer and softer than velvet. <i><b>Plush</b> upholstery.</i>
<b>razor</b>	Shave with a razor. <i>The tapered cut is <b>razored</b> to give movement.</i>
<b>shave</b>	Make shavings of or reduce to shavings. <i>He washed <b>shaved</b> and had breakfast.</i>
<b>shaving</b>	The action of shaving. <i>She brushed wood <b>shavings</b> from her knees.</i>

- snip** Sever or remove by pinching or snipping.  
*The wine is a **snip** at 3 65.*
- snippet** A small piece of anything (especially a piece that has been snipped off).  
***Snippets** of information about the war.*
- tonsure** Shave the hair on top of a monk s or priest s head give a tonsure to.  
*His hair is thinning up there soon he ll have a **tonsure** like a monk s.*
- trim** Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.  
***Trim** the grass using a sharp mower.*
- whittle** Carve (an object) from wood.  
*The shortlist of fifteen was **whittled** down to five.*
