## Associations of "Short lived" (30 Words)

<b>abide</b>	Accept or act in accordance with (a rule, decision, or recommendation). <i>I said I would <b>abide</b> by their decision.</i>
<b>absent</b>	Not being in a specified place. <i>An <b>absent</b> minded professor.</i>
<a href="#"><u>armistice</u></a>	An agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time; a truce. <i>The Italian government signed an <b>armistice</b> with the Allies.</i>
<a href="#"><u>cessation</u></a>	A stopping. <i>A <b>cessation</b> of animal testing of cosmetics.</i>
<b>discontinuance</b>	The act of discontinuing or breaking off; an interruption (temporary or permanent).
<a href="#"><u>dwell</u></a>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>The problems <b>dwell</b> in the social injustices in this country.</i>
<b>ephemeral</b>	An ephemeral plant. <i>The <b>ephemeral</b> joys of childhood.</i>
<a href="#"><u>fleeting</u></a>	Lasting for a very short time. <i>A <b>fleeting</b> glance.</i>
<b>fugitive</b>	A person who has escaped from captivity or is in hiding. <i>The <b>fugitive</b> effects of light.</i>
<a href="#"><u>inadequacy</u></a>	A lack of competence. <i>Her feelings of personal <b>inadequacy</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>inhabit</u></a>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>Sweet memories <b>inhabit</b> this house.</i>
<a href="#"><u>insufficient</u></a>	Not enough; inadequate. <i>There was <b>insufficient</b> evidence to convict him.</i>
<b>lacking</b>	Nonexistent. <i>Adequate resources are sadly <b>lacking</b>.</i>

<b><u>lifelong</u></b>	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>The two men were to remain <b>lifelong</b> friends.</i>
<b><u>meager</u></b>	Deficient in amount or quality or extent. <i><b>Meager</b> resources.</i>
<b>momentary</b>	Lasting for a markedly brief time. <i>A <b>momentary</b> lapse of concentration.</i>
<b>overview</b>	A general summary of a subject. <i>The report <b>overviews</b> the needs of the community.</i>
<b>paucity</b>	An insufficient quantity or number. <i>A <b>paucity</b> of information.</i>
<b>populate</b>	Inhabit or live in; be an inhabitant of. <i>A cosy rural town <b>populated</b> with friendly folk.</i>
<b>provisional</b>	A provisional stamp. <i>Norman as yet had only a <b>provisional</b> licence.</i>
<b>provisory</b>	Provisional. <i>A <b>provisory</b> clause.</i>
<b>scant</b>	Deal with inadequately; neglect. <i>He does not <b>scant</b> his attention to the later writings.</i>
<b>sojourn</b>	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest). <i>She had <b>sojourned</b> once in Egypt.</i>
<b>stay</b>	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i><b>Stay</b> a bit longer the day is still young.</i>
<b>stopgap</b>	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a <b>stopgap</b> until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
<b>subsist</b>	Remain in force or effect. <i>Many people in the world have to <b>subsist</b> on 1 a day.</i>
<b>temporary</b>	A person employed on a temporary basis typically an office worker who finds employment through an agency. <i><b>Temporary</b> housing.</i>
<b>transitory</b>	Not permanent. <i><b>Transitory</b> periods of medieval greatness.</i>
<b><u>truce</u></b>	An agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time. <i>The guerrillas called a three day <b>truce</b>.</i>
<b>wanting</b>	Lacking in a required or necessary quality. <i>Mandibles are <b>wanting</b> in many of these insects.</i>
