Associations of "Short lived" (30 Words)

abide	Accept or act in accordance with (a rule, decision, or recommendation). <i>I said I would abide by their decision.</i>
absent	Not being in a specified place. <i>An absentminded professor.</i>
armistice	An agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time; a truce. <i>The Italian government signed an armistice with the Allies.</i>
cessation	A stopping. <i>A cessation of animal testing of cosmetics.</i>
discontinuance	The act of discontinuing or breaking off; an interruption (temporary or permanent).
dwell	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>The problems dwell in the social injustices in this country.</i>
ephemeral	An ephemeral plant. <i>The ephemeral joys of childhood.</i>
fleeting	Lasting for a very short time. <i>A fleeting glance.</i>
fugitive	A person who has escaped from captivity or is in hiding. <i>The fugitive effects of light.</i>
inadequacy	A lack of competence. <i>Her feelings of personal inadequacy.</i>
inhabit	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>Sweet memories inhabit this house.</i>
insufficient	Not enough; inadequate. <i>There was insufficient evidence to convict him.</i>
lacking	Nonexistent. <i>Adequate resources are sadly lacking.</i>

<u>lifelong</u>	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>The two men were to remain lifelong friends.</i>
<u>meager</u>	Deficient in amount or quality or extent. <i>Meager resources.</i>
momentary	Lasting for a markedly brief time. <i>A momentary lapse of concentration.</i>
overview	A general summary of a subject. <i>The report overviews the needs of the community.</i>
paucity	An insufficient quantity or number. <i>A paucity of information.</i>
populate	Inhabit or live in; be an inhabitant of. <i>A cosy rural town populated with friendly folk.</i>
provisional	A provisional stamp. <i>Norman as yet had only a provisional licence.</i>
provisory	Provisional. <i>A provisory clause.</i>
scant	Deal with inadequately; neglect. <i>He does not scant his attention to the later writings.</i>
sojourn	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest). <i>She had sojourned once in Egypt.</i>
stay	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i>Stay a bit longer the day is still young.</i>
stopgap	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a stopgap until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
subsist	Remain in force or effect. <i>Many people in the world have to subsist on 1 a day.</i>
temporary	A person employed on a temporary basis typically an office worker who finds employment through an agency. <i>Temporary housing.</i>
transitory	Not permanent. <i>Transitory periods of medieval greatness.</i>
<u>truce</u>	An agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time. <i>The guerrillas called a three day truce.</i>
wanting	Lacking in a required or necessary quality. <i>Mandibles are wanting in many of these insects.</i>
