Associations of "Short sighted" (30 Words)

abbreviate	Shorten the duration of; cut short. <i>I decided to abbreviate my stay in Cambridge.</i>
abbreviated	Shortened; cut short. <i>We intended to run an abbreviated event.</i>
brief	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>Introductions were brief and polite.</i>
concise	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A concise account of the country s history.</i>
ephemeral	An ephemeral plant. <i>Fashions are ephemeral new ones regularly drive out the old.</i>
fleeting	Lasting for a very short time. <i>For a fleeting moment I saw the face of a boy.</i>
fugitive	Someone who is sought by law officers; someone trying to elude justice. <i>Fugitive hours.</i>
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>She only glanced at the paper.</i>
inadequacy	The state or quality of being inadequate; lack of the quantity or quality required. <i>The inadequacy of available resources.</i>
insufficient	Not enough; inadequate. <i>There was insufficient evidence to convict him.</i>
lacking	Nonexistent. <i>The students are not lacking in intellectual ability.</i>
momentary	Lasting for a markedly brief time. <i>A momentary lapse of concentration.</i>

myopic	Unable to see distant objects clearly. <i>The government still has a myopic attitude to public spending.</i>
nearsighted	Unable to see distant objects clearly.
overview	Give a general review or summary of. <i>The report overviews the needs of the community.</i>
paucity	The presence of something in only small or insufficient quantities or amounts. <i>A paucity of information.</i>
perihelion	The point in the orbit of a planet, asteroid, or comet at which it is closest to the sun. <i>Today Mercury is at perihelion.</i>
precis	Make a precis of a text or speech.
provisional	A provisional stamp. <i>Provisional bookings.</i>
scant	Barely sufficient or adequate. <i>He does not scant his attention to the later writings.</i>
sojourn	Stay somewhere temporarily. <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i>
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
temporary	A worker especially in an office hired on a temporary basis. <i>Employed on a temporary basis.</i>
terse	Sparing in the use of words; abrupt. <i>A terse statement.</i>
transience	The attribute of being brief or fleeting. <i>The transience of life and happiness.</i>
transient	Staying or working in a place for a short time only. <i>Youth's transient beauty.</i>
transitory	Lasting a very short time. <i>Love is transitory but it is eternal.</i>
truce	A state of peace agreed to between opponents so they can discuss peace terms. <i>The guerrillas called a three day truce.</i>
truncate	Shorten the duration or extent of. <i>He was a sensational player whose career was truncated by injuries.</i>
wanting	Inadequate in amount or degree. <i>Mandibles are wanting in many of these insects.</i>
