<b>abbreviate</b>	Shorten the duration of; cut short. <i>I decided to <b>abbreviate</b> my stay in Cambridge.</i>
<b>abbreviated</b>	Shortened; cut short. <i>We intended to run an <b>abbreviated</b> event.</i>
<b><a href="#">brief</a></b>	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>Introductions were <b>brief</b> and polite.</i>
<b><a href="#">concise</a></b>	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A <b>concise</b> account of the country s history.</i>
<b>ephemeral</b>	An ephemeral plant. <i>Fashions are <b>ephemeral</b> new ones regularly drive out the old.</i>
<b><a href="#">fleeting</a></b>	Lasting for a very short time. <i>For a <b>fleeting</b> moment I saw the face of a boy.</i>
<b>fugitive</b>	Someone who is sought by law officers; someone trying to elude justice. <i><b>Fugitive</b> hours.</i>
<b>glance</b>	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>She only <b>glanced</b> at the paper.</i>
<b><a href="#">inadequacy</a></b>	The state or quality of being inadequate; lack of the quantity or quality required. <i>The <b>inadequacy</b> of available resources.</i>
<b><a href="#">insufficient</a></b>	Not enough; inadequate. <i>There was <b>insufficient</b> evidence to convict him.</i>
<b>lacking</b>	Nonexistent. <i>The students are not <b>lacking</b> in intellectual ability.</i>
<b>momentary</b>	Lasting for a markedly brief time. <i>A <b>momentary</b> lapse of concentration.</i>

<b>myopic</b>	Unable to see distant objects clearly. <i>The government still has a <b>myopic</b> attitude to public spending.</i>
<b>nearsighted</b>	Unable to see distant objects clearly.
<b>overview</b>	Give a general review or summary of. <i>The report <b>overviews</b> the needs of the community.</i>
<b>paucity</b>	The presence of something in only small or insufficient quantities or amounts. <i>A <b>paucity</b> of information.</i>
<b>perihelion</b>	The point in the orbit of a planet, asteroid, or comet at which it is closest to the sun. <i>Today Mercury is at <b>perihelion</b>.</i>
<b>precis</b>	Make a precis of a text or speech.
<b>provisional</b>	A provisional stamp. <i><b>Provisional</b> bookings.</i>
<b>scant</b>	Barely sufficient or adequate. <i>He does not <b>scant</b> his attention to the later writings.</i>
<b>sojourn</b>	Stay somewhere temporarily. <i>Her <b>sojourn</b> in Rome.</i>
<b>succinctness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>temporary</b>	A worker especially in an office hired on a temporary basis. <i>Employed on a <b>temporary</b> basis.</i>
<b>terse</b>	Sparing in the use of words; abrupt. <i>A <b>terse</b> statement.</i>
<b>transience</b>	The attribute of being brief or fleeting. <i>The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.</i>
<b>transient</b>	Staying or working in a place for a short time only. <i>Youth's <b>transient</b> beauty.</i>
<b>transitory</b>	Lasting a very short time. <i>Love is <b>transitory</b> but it is eternal.</i>
<b>truce</b>	A state of peace agreed to between opponents so they can discuss peace terms. <i>The guerrillas called a three day <b>truce</b>.</i>
<b>truncate</b>	Shorten the duration or extent of. <i>He was a sensational player whose career was <b>truncated</b> by injuries.</i>
<b>wanting</b>	Inadequate in amount or degree. <i>Mandibles are <b>wanting</b> in many of these insects.</i>
