| <b><a href="#">fleeting</a></b>     | Lasting for a very short time.<br><i>For a <b>fleeting</b> moment I saw the face of a boy.</i>  |
| <b>fugitive</b>                     | Someone who is sought by law officers; someone trying to elude justice.<br><i><b>Fugitive</b> hours.</i>                                      |
| <b>glance</b>                       | Throw a glance at take a brief look at.<br><i>She only <b>glanced</b> at the paper.</i>   |
| <b><a href="#">inadequacy</a></b>   | The state or quality of being inadequate; lack of the quantity or quality required.<br><i>The <b>inadequacy</b> of available resources.</i>   |
| <b><a href="#">insufficient</a></b> | Not enough; inadequate.<br><i>There was <b>insufficient</b> evidence to convict him.</i>  |
| <b>lacking</b>                      | Nonexistent.<br><i>The students are not <b>lacking</b> in intellectual ability.</i>   |
| <b>momentary</b>                    | Lasting for a markedly brief time.<br><i>A <b>momentary</b> lapse of concentration.</i>   |

| <b>myopic</b>       | Unable to see distant objects clearly.<br><i>The government still has a <b>myopic</b> attitude to public spending.</i>                     |
| <b>nearsighted</b>  | Unable to see distant objects clearly.   |
| <b>overview</b>     | Give a general review or summary of.<br><i>The report <b>overviews</b> the needs of the community.</i>                                     |
| <b>paucity</b>      | The presence of something in only small or insufficient quantities or amounts.<br><i>A <b>paucity</b> of information.</i>                  |
| <b>perihelion</b>   | The point in the orbit of a planet, asteroid, or comet at which it is closest to the sun.<br><i>Today Mercury is at <b>perihelion</b>.</i> |
| <b>precis</b>       | Make a precis of a text or speech.   |
| <b>provisional</b>  | A provisional stamp.<br><i><b>Provisional</b> bookings.</i>  |
| <b>scant</b>        | Barely sufficient or adequate.<br><i>He does not <b>scant</b> his attention to the later writings.</i>                                     |
| <b>sojourn</b>      | Stay somewhere temporarily.<br><i>Her <b>sojourn</b> in Rome.</i>  |
| <b>succinctness</b> | Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.                                     |
| <b>temporary</b>    | A worker especially in an office hired on a temporary basis.<br><i>Employed on a <b>temporary</b> basis.</i>                               |
| <b>terse</b>        | Sparing in the use of words; abrupt.<br><i>A <b>terse</b> statement.</i>   |
| <b>transience</b>   | The attribute of being brief or fleeting.<br><i>The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.</i>   |
| <b>transient</b>    | Staying or working in a place for a short time only.<br><i>Youth's <b>transient</b> beauty.</i>  |
| <b>transitory</b>   | Lasting a very short time.<br><i>Love is <b>transitory</b> but it is eternal.</i>  |
| <b>truce</b>        | A state of peace agreed to between opponents so they can discuss peace terms.<br><i>The guerrillas called a three day <b>truce</b>.</i>    |
| <b>truncate</b>     | Shorten the duration or extent of.<br><i>He was a sensational player whose career was <b>truncated</b> by injuries.</i>                    |
| <b>wanting</b>      | Inadequate in amount or degree.<br><i>Mandibles are <b>wanting</b> in many of these insects.</i>   |
