<b>abbreviated</b>	Shortened; cut short. <i>We intended to run an <b>abbreviated</b> event.</i>
<b>abbreviation</b>	A shortened form of a word or phrase. <i>SKU is the <b>abbreviation</b> for Stock Keeping Unit.</i>
<a href="#">armistice</a>	An agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time; a truce. <i>The Italian government signed an <b>armistice</b> with the Allies.</i>
<a href="#">brief</a>	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>Covered the matter in a <b>brief</b> statement.</i>
<a href="#">cessation</a>	A stopping. <i>A <b>cessation</b> of animal testing of cosmetics.</i>
<a href="#">concise</a>	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A <b>concise</b> account of the country's history.</i>
<b>conditional</b>	The conditional mood of a verb for example should in if I should die. <i>The <b>conditional</b> sale will not be complete until the full purchase price is paid.</i>
<b>ellipsis</b>	A set of dots indicating an ellipsis. <i>An example of <b>ellipsis</b>.</i>
<b>ephemeral</b>	An ephemeral plant. <i>The <b>ephemeral</b> joys of childhood.</i>
<a href="#">fleeting</a>	Lasting for a very short time. <i>For a <b>fleeting</b> moment I saw the face of a boy.</i>
<a href="#">insufficient</a>	Not enough; inadequate. <i><b>Insufficient</b> funds.</i>
<b>lacking</b>	Nonexistent. <i>There was something <b>lacking</b> in our marriage.</i>

<b>momentary</b>	Lasting for a very short time; brief. A <b>momentary</b> <i>glimpse</i> .
<b>overview</b>	A general summary of a subject. The report <b>overviews</b> the needs of the community.
<b>paucity</b>	An insufficient quantity or number. A <b>paucity</b> of information.
<b>pithiness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>provisional</b>	A provisional stamp. Norman as yet had only a <b>provisional</b> licence.
<b>provisory</b>	Subject to a proviso; conditional. A <b>provisory</b> clause.
<b>scant</b>	Supply sparingly and with restricted quantities. The press regularly <b>scants</b> a host of issues relating to safety and health.
<b>stopgap</b>	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. Transplants are only a <b>stopgap</b> until more sophisticated alternatives can work.
<b>succinct</b>	Briefly giving the gist of something. <b>Succinct</b> comparisons.
<b>succinctness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>temporary</b>	A worker especially in an office hired on a temporary basis. Employed on a <b>temporary</b> basis.
<b>terse</b>	Sparing in the use of words; abrupt. A <b>terse</b> statement.
<b>transience</b>	An impermanence that suggests the inevitability of ending or dying. The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.
<b>transient</b>	A short-lived oscillation in a system caused by a sudden change of voltage or current or load. The <b>transient</b> nature of the labour force in catering.
<b>transitory</b>	Lasting a very short time. <b>Transitory</b> periods of medieval greatness.
<b>truce</b>	An agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time. The guerrillas called a three day <b>truce</b> .
<b>truncate</b>	Shorten by cutting off the top or end. Erosion has <b>truncated</b> the ridges of the mountains.
