abbreviated	Shortened; cut short. <i>We intended to run an abbreviated event.</i>
abbreviation	A shortened form of a word or phrase. <i>SKU is the abbreviation for Stock Keeping Unit.</i>
armistice	An agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time; a truce. <i>The Italian government signed an armistice with the Allies.</i>
brief	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>Covered the matter in a brief statement.</i>
cessation	A stopping. <i>A cessation of animal testing of cosmetics.</i>
concise	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A concise account of the country s history.</i>
conditional	The conditional mood of a verb for example should in if I should die. <i>The conditional sale will not be complete until the full purchase price is paid.</i>
ellipsis	A set of dots indicating an ellipsis. <i>An example of ellipsis.</i>
ephemeral	An ephemeral plant. <i>The ephemeral joys of childhood.</i>
fleeting	Lasting for a very short time. <i>For a fleeting moment I saw the face of a boy.</i>
insufficient	Not enough; inadequate. <i>Insufficient funds.</i>
lacking	Nonexistent. <i>There was something lacking in our marriage.</i>

momentary	Lasting for a very short time; brief. A momentary <i>glimpse</i> .
overview	A general summary of a subject. <i>The report overviews the needs of the community.</i>
paucity	An insufficient quantity or number. A paucity of information.
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
provisional	A provisional stamp. <i>Norman as yet had only a provisional licence.</i>
provisory	Subject to a proviso; conditional. A provisory clause.
scant	Supply sparingly and with restricted quantities. <i>The press regularly scants a host of issues relating to safety and health.</i>
stopgap	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a stopgap until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
succinct	Briefly giving the gist of something. Succinct comparisons.
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
temporary	A worker especially in an office hired on a temporary basis. <i>Employed on a temporary basis.</i>
terse	Sparing in the use of words; abrupt. A terse statement.
transience	An impermanence that suggests the inevitability of ending or dying. <i>The transience of life and happiness.</i>
transient	A short-lived oscillation in a system caused by a sudden change of voltage or current or load. <i>The transient nature of the labour force in catering.</i>
transitory	Lasting a very short time. Transitory periods of medieval greatness.
truce	An agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time. <i>The guerrillas called a three day truce.</i>
truncate	Shorten by cutting off the top or end. <i>Erosion has truncated the ridges of the mountains.</i>
