| <b><u>ammunition</u></b> | Any nuclear or chemical or biological material that can be used as a weapon of mass destruction.<br><i>These figures provide <b>ammunition</b> to the argument for more resources.</i>             |
| <b>arms</b>              | Distinctive emblems or devices originally borne on shields in battle and now forming the heraldic insignia of families, corporations, or countries.<br><i><b>Arms</b> and ammunition.</i>          |
| <b>artillery</b>         | An army unit that uses big guns.<br><i>Each corps included two regiments of field <b>artillery</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>bombard</u></b>    | A cannon of the earliest type, which fired a stone ball or large shot.<br><i>The governor was <b>bombarded</b> with requests to grant a pardon to the convicted killer.</i>                        |
| <b><u>bullet</u></b>     | A high-speed passenger train.<br><i>All afternoon he threw <b>bullets</b> at the other team s batters.</i>   |
| <b>caliber</b>           | Diameter of a tube or gun barrel.<br><i>An executive of low <b>caliber</b>.</i>  |
| <b>cannon</b>            | Fire a cannon.<br><i>His shot <b>cannoned</b> off the crossbar.</i>  |
| <b>cartridge</b>         | Ammunition consisting of a cylindrical casing containing an explosive charge and a bullet; fired from a rifle or handgun.<br><i>He loaded a <b>cartridge</b> of fresh tape into the tape deck.</i> |
| <b>catapult</b>          | Move suddenly or at great speed as though hurled by a catapult.<br><i>Their music <b>catapulted</b> them to the top of the charts.</i>   |
| <b>firearm</b>           | A portable gun.<br><i>He wore his <b>firearm</b> in a shoulder holster.</i>  |
| <b>firing</b>            | The act of firing weapons or artillery at an enemy.<br><i>The deliberate <b>firing</b> of 600 oil wells.</i>   |
| <b>fusillade</b>         | Attack with fusillade.<br><i>The Mahdi s adherents <b>fusilladed</b> his palace at Khartoum.</i>   |

| <b>grenade</b>  | A glass receptacle containing chemicals which are released when the receptacle is thrown and broken, used for testing drains and extinguishing fires.   |
| <b>gun</b>      | A gunman.<br><i>A hired <b>gun</b>.</i>   |
| <b>hammock</b>  | A small natural hill.   |
| <b>ignition</b> | The mechanism for bringing about ignition in an internal combustion engine typically activated by a key or switch.<br><i>A small amount of diesel fuel must be injected to allow <b>ignition</b>.</i> |
| <b>immunize</b> | Law: grant immunity from prosecution.<br><i>The vaccine is used to <b>immunize</b> children against measles.</i>  |
| <b>munition</b> | Supply with munitions.<br><i><b>Munition</b> factories.</i>   |
| <b>musket</b>   | A muzzle-loading shoulder gun with a long barrel; formerly used by infantrymen.<br><i>A volley of <b>musket</b> fire.</i>   |
| <b>ordnance</b> | Munitions.<br><i>Unexploded <b>ordnance</b>.</i>  |
| <b>pistol</b>   | Shoot someone with a pistol.<br><i>When we first met he was a <b>pistol</b> full of ideals and a natural leader.</i>  |
| <b>revolver</b> | A door consisting of four orthogonal partitions that rotate about a central pivot; a door designed to equalize the air pressure in tall buildings.  |
| <b>rifle</b>    | A shoulder firearm with a long barrel and a rifled bore.<br><i>A hunting <b>rifle</b>.</i>  |
| <b>salvo</b>    | An outburst resembling the discharge of firearms or the release of bombs.<br><i>There was a <b>salvo</b> of approval.</i>   |
| <b>shoot</b>    | Of a plant or seed send out buds or shoots germinate.<br><i>A ball pitching on that spot would sometimes <b>shoot</b>.</i>  |
| <b>shooting</b> | The sport or pastime of shooting with a gun.<br><i>20 000 fatal <b>shootings</b> a year.</i>  |
| <b>sling</b>    | Hold or carry in a sling.<br><i>I wasn't <b>slinging</b> off at your religion.</i>  |
| <b>trigger</b>  | Release or pull the trigger on.<br><i>An allergy can be <b>triggered</b> by stress or overwork.</i>   |
| <b>turret</b>   | A rotating holder for tools, especially on a lathe.<br><i>A castle with fairy tale <b>turrets</b>.</i>  |

**weapon**
