## Associations of "Shout out" (30 Words)

<b>bawl</b>	Shout loudly and without restraint. <i>He addressed every class in a terrifying <b>bawl</b>.</i>
<b>bellow</b>	A deep roaring shout or sound. <i>He <b>bellowed</b> in agony.</i>
<b>bluster</b>	A violent gusty wind. <i>A winter gale <b>blustered</b> against the sides of the house.</i>
<b>boo</b>	An utterance of boo to show disapproval of a speaker or performer. <i>They <b>booed</b> and hissed when he stepped on stage.</i>
<b>complain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>Her husband began to <b>complain</b> of headaches.</i>
<b>cry</b>	Bring into a particular state by crying. <i>She heard a voice <b>crying</b> her name.</i>
<a href="#"><b>exclaim</b></a>	Cry out suddenly in surprise, strong emotion, or pain. <i>I won he <b>exclaimed</b>.</i>
<b>gripe</b>	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>If your baby has <b>gripe</b> or is teething we have the medication to help them.</i>
<a href="#"><b>growl</b></a>	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he <b>growled</b>.</i>
<b>heckler</b>	Someone who tries to embarrass you with gibes and questions and objections. <i>He was adept at dealing with <b>hecklers</b>.</i>
<b>holler</b>	A type of work song originally sung by black slaves in the US that later contributed to the development of the blues. <i>He <b>hollers</b> when he wants feeding.</i>
<a href="#"><b>howl</b></a>	Make a howling sound. <i><b>Howl</b> with sorrow.</i>
<b>howling</b>	Filled with or characterized by howling. <i>A <b>howling</b> success.</i>

<b>leonine</b>	Of or characteristic of or resembling a lion. <i>A handsome <b>leonine</b> profile.</i>
<b>loud</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>There were <b>loud</b> protests from the lumber barons.</i>
<b>loudly</b>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively loudly. <i>She spoke <b>loudly</b> and angrily.</i>
<b>outcry</b>	Shout louder than. <i>The public <b>outcry</b> over the bombing.</i>
<a href="#"><u>rant</u></a>	A spell of ranting a tirade. <i>She was still <b>ranting</b> on about the unfairness of it all.</i>
<b>resounding</b>	Characterized by resonance. <i>A <b>resounding</b> smack across the face.</i>
<a href="#"><u>roar</u></a>	A deep prolonged loud noise. <i>Get out of my way he <b>roared</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>rumble</u></a>	Take part in a street fight between gangs or large groups. <i>A <b>rumble</b> between two gangs of street hoodlums.</i>
<a href="#"><u>scream</u></a>	Cry something in a high-pitched, frenzied way. <i>The creative side of me is <b>screaming</b> out for attention.</i>
<b>screech</b>	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>Mary tried to drown her <b>screeches</b> by shaking her.</i>
<b>shriek</b>	Be very obvious or strikingly discordant. <i>The patterned carpets <b>shrieked</b> at Blanche from the shabby store.</i>
<a href="#"><u>shrill</u></a>	Make a shrill noise. <i>A <b>shrill</b> gaiety.</i>
<b>squawk</b>	The noise of squawking. <i>The <b>squawk</b> of car horns.</i>
<b>thunder</b>	Be the case that thunder is being heard. <i>I am Brother Joachim he announced in a voice like <b>thunder</b>.</i>
<b>wail</b>	Utter a wail. <i><b>Wail</b> in self pity.</i>
<b>whine</b>	A long, high-pitched unpleasant sound. <i>A constant <b>whine</b> about the quality of public services.</i>
