Associations of "Shout out" (30 Words)

bawl	Shout loudly and without restraint. <i>He addressed every class in a terrifying bawl.</i>
bellow	A deep roaring shout or sound. <i>He bellowed in agony.</i>
bluster	A violent gusty wind. <i>A winter gale blustered against the sides of the house.</i>
boo	An utterance of boo to show disapproval of a speaker or performer. <i>They booed and hissed when he stepped on stage.</i>
complain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>Her husband began to complain of headaches.</i>
cry	Bring into a particular state by crying. <i>She heard a voice crying her name.</i>
exclaim	Cry out suddenly in surprise, strong emotion, or pain. <i>I won he exclaimed.</i>
gripe	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>If your baby has gripe or is teething we have the medication to help them.</i>
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he growled.</i>
heckler	Someone who tries to embarrass you with gibes and questions and objections. <i>He was adept at dealing with hecklers.</i>
holler	A type of work song originally sung by black slaves in the US that later contributed to the development of the blues. <i>He hollers when he wants feeding.</i>
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>Howl with sorrow.</i>
howling	Filled with or characterized by howling. <i>A howling success.</i>

leonine	Of or characteristic of or resembling a lion. <i>A handsome leonine profile.</i>
loud	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>There were loud protests from the lumber barons.</i>
loudly	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively loudly. <i>She spoke loudly and angrily.</i>
outcry	Shout louder than. <i>The public outcry over the bombing.</i>
<u>rant</u>	A spell of ranting a tirade. <i>She was still ranting on about the unfairness of it all.</i>
resounding	Characterized by resonance. <i>A resounding smack across the face.</i>
<u>roar</u>	A deep prolonged loud noise. <i>Get out of my way he roared.</i>
<u>rumble</u>	Take part in a street fight between gangs or large groups. <i>A rumble between two gangs of street hoodlums.</i>
<u>scream</u>	Cry something in a high-pitched, frenzied way. <i>The creative side of me is screaming out for attention.</i>
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>Mary tried to drown her screeches by shaking her.</i>
shriek	Be very obvious or strikingly discordant. <i>The patterned carpets shrieked at Blanche from the shabby store.</i>
<u>shrill</u>	Make a shrill noise. <i>A shrill gaiety.</i>
squawk	The noise of squawking. <i>The squawk of car horns.</i>
thunder	Be the case that thunder is being heard. <i>I am Brother Joachim he announced in a voice like thunder.</i>
wail	Utter a wail. <i>Wail in self pity.</i>
whine	A long, high-pitched unpleasant sound. <i>A constant whine about the quality of public services.</i>
<u>yell</u>	Shout in a loud, sharp way. <i>A yell of pain.</i>
