screech	Sharp piercing cry. A <b>screech</b> of brakes.
shriek	A high-pitched piercing cry or sound; a scream. <i>Shrieks of laughter.</i>
squall	A loud cry. Low clouds and <b>squall</b> s of driving rain.
squawk	The noise of squawking. Her plan provoked a loud <b>squawk</b> from her friends.
wail	A prolonged high-pitched sound. The <b>wail</b> of an air raid siren.
yawp	A harsh or hoarse cry or yelp. The cur did not bark other than a single <b>yawp</b> .
yelp	A short, sharp cry, especially of pain or alarm. She uttered a <b>yelp</b> as she bumped into a table.

<u>howl</u>	Make a howling sound. They <b>howl</b> ed me down and called me a chauvinist.
pipe	Convey water gas oil or other fluid substances through a pipe or pipes. <i>Pipe</i> oil water and gas into the desert.
pipe up	Utter a shrill cry.
<u>scream</u>	Make a loud, piercing sound. He <b>scream</b> ed abuse down the phone.
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. The van <b>screech</b> ed round a bend at speed.
shriek	(of something inanimate) make a high-pitched screeching sound. The answer <b>shriek</b> ed at her all too clearly.
squall	Blow in a squall. Sarah was <b>squall</b> ing in her crib.
squawk	Utter a harsh abrupt scream. What are you doing she <b>squawk</b> ed.
wail	Utter a wail. The wind <b>wail</b> ed and buffeted the timber structure.
yawp	Talk foolishly or noisily. The fans screeched <b>yawp</b> ed and pounded their palms.
yelp	Utter a yelp. My dog was <b>yelp</b> ing as if hurt.

- A piercing whistle shrilled through the night air.
- 'How dare you!' she shrilled.

# Shrill as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Shrill" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "shrill" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of a voice or sound) high-pitched and piercing.
- Of colors that are bright and gaudy.
- (especially of a complaint or demand) loud and forceful.

## Synonyms of "Shrill" as an adjective (14 Words)

high	Being at or having a relatively great or specific elevation or upward extension sometimes used in combinations like knee high. A <b>high</b> incline.
high-pitched	Set at a sharp or high angle or slant.
<u>intrusive</u>	Relating to or formed by intrusion. That was an <b>intrusive</b> question.
loud	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>Her voice was too <b>loud</b>.</i>
penetrating	Able to make a way through or into something. <i>Her <b>penetrating</b> gaze.</i>
<u>piercing</u>	(of a feeling) intense, typically in a distressing way. <i>Piercing knifelike pains.</i>
screeching	Used in reference to the sound made by the sudden stopping of a vehicle as a result of a forceful application of the brakes. <i>The truck came to a screeching halt.</i>
screechy	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
<u>sharp</u>	Having or emitting a high pitched and sharp tone or tones. His old mind was not so <b>sharp</b> as it once was.
shattering	Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering. <i>The shattering tones of the enormous carillon.</i>
shrieking	Making a high-pitched piercing cry or sound. A <b>shrieking</b> ambulance.
squawky	Like the cackles or squawks a hen makes especially after laying an egg. Their voices are high and birdlike and <b>squawky</b> .
strident	Unpleasantly loud and harsh. <i>Strident</i> demands.
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. His imagery made a <b>strong</b> impression on the critics.

fang	The biting mouthpart of a spider. The dog was bounding towards him its <b>fang</b> s bared.
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>Howl</i> s of laughter.
incisive	(of an account) accurate and sharply focused. <i>Incisive teeth</i> .
insightful	Exhibiting insight or clear and deep perception-R.C.Angell. Thank you for all the <b>insightful</b> comments.



keen	Having or showing eagerness or enthusiasm. <i>Keen winds</i> .
keenness	A positive feeling of wanting to push ahead with something. <i>He has expressed his <b>keenness</b> to retain his job.</i>
penetrating	Having or demonstrating ability to recognize or draw fine distinctions. <i>Penetrating insight</i> .
perceptive	Of or relating to perception. A <b>perceptive</b> observation.
<b>piercing</b>	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. Two months ago I decided to take out all my <b>piercing</b> s.
piquant	Pleasantly stimulating or exciting to the mind. A <b>piquant</b> tartare sauce.
pointed	Direct and obvious in meaning or reference; often unpleasant. A <b>pointed</b> allusion to what was going on.
projection	The projection of an image from a film onto a screen. The band use stage <b>projection</b> s featuring moon shots.
pungent	(of comment, criticism, or humour) having a sharp and caustic quality. <i>The <b>pungent</b> smell of frying onions.</i>
scalpel	A thin straight surgical knife used in dissection and surgery.
scissors	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy scissors from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>
<u>sharp</u>	Keenly and painfully felt as if caused by a sharp edge or point. A <b>sharp</b> pain.
shrewd	(especially of weather) piercingly cold. She was <b>shrewd</b> enough to guess the motive behind his gesture.
sickle	A short-handled farming tool with a semicircular blade, used for cutting corn, lopping, or trimming.
understanding	Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy. I knew I could count on his <b>understanding</b> .
whet	Sharpen by rubbing as on a whetstone. <i>Here s an extract to <b>whet</b> your appetite.</i>
