screech	Sharp piercing cry. A screech of brakes.
shriek	A high-pitched piercing cry or sound; a scream. <i>Shrieks of laughter.</i>
squall	A loud cry. Low clouds and squall s of driving rain.
squawk	The noise of squawking. Her plan provoked a loud squawk from her friends.
wail	A prolonged high-pitched sound. The wail of an air raid siren.
yawp	A harsh or hoarse cry or yelp. The cur did not bark other than a single yawp .
yelp	A short, sharp cry, especially of pain or alarm. She uttered a yelp as she bumped into a table.

pipe	Convey water gas oil or other fluid substances through a pipe or pipes. <i>Pipe</i> oil water and gas into the desert.
pipe up	Utter a shrill cry.
<u>scream</u>	Make a loud, piercing sound. He scream ed abuse down the phone.
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. The van screech ed round a bend at speed.
shriek	(of something inanimate) make a high-pitched screeching sound. The answer shriek ed at her all too clearly.
squall	Blow in a squall. Sarah was squall ing in her crib.
squawk	Utter a harsh abrupt scream. What are you doing she squawk ed.
wail	Utter a wail. The wind wail ed and buffeted the timber structure.
yawp	Talk foolishly or noisily. The fans screeched yawp ed and pounded their palms.
yelp	Utter a yelp. My dog was yelp ing as if hurt.

- A piercing whistle shrilled through the night air.
- 'How dare you!' she shrilled.

Shrill as an Adjective

Definitions of "Shrill" as an adjective

Synonyms of "Shrill" as an adjective (14 Words)

high	Being at or having a relatively great or specific elevation or upward extension sometimes used in combinations like knee high. A high incline.
high-pitched	Set at a sharp or high angle or slant.
<u>intrusive</u>	Relating to or formed by intrusion. That was an intrusive question.
loud	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>Her voice was too loud.</i>
penetrating	Able to make a way through or into something. <i>Her penetrating gaze.</i>
<u>piercing</u>	(of a feeling) intense, typically in a distressing way. <i>Piercing knifelike pains.</i>
screeching	Used in reference to the sound made by the sudden stopping of a vehicle as a result of a forceful application of the brakes. <i>The truck came to a screeching halt.</i>

<u>sharp</u>	Having or emitting a high pitched and sharp tone or tones. His old mind was not so sharp as it once was.
shattering	Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering. <i>The shattering tones of the enormous carillon.</i>
shrieking	Making a high-pitched piercing cry or sound. A shrieking ambulance.
squawky	Like the cackles or squawks a hen makes especially after laying an egg. Their voices are high and birdlike and squawky .
strident	Unpleasantly loud and harsh. <i>Strident</i> demands.
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. His imagery made a strong impression on the critics.

incisive	(of an account) accurate and sharply focused. <i>Incisive teeth</i> .
insightful	Exhibiting insight or clear and deep perception-R.C.Angell. Thank you for all the insightful comments.



keen	Having or showing eagerness or enthusiasm. <i>Keen winds</i> .
keenness	A positive feeling of wanting to push ahead with something. <i>He has expressed his keenness to retain his job.</i>
penetrating	Having or demonstrating ability to recognize or draw fine distinctions. <i>Penetrating insight</i> .
perceptive	Of or relating to perception. A perceptive observation.
piercing	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. Two months ago I decided to take out all my piercing s.
piquant	Pleasantly stimulating or exciting to the mind. A piquant tartare sauce.
pointed	Direct and obvious in meaning or reference; often unpleasant. A pointed allusion to what was going on.
projection	The projection of an image from a film onto a screen. The band use stage projection s featuring moon shots.
pungent	(of comment, criticism, or humour) having a sharp and caustic quality. <i>The pungent smell of frying onions.</i>
scalpel	A thin straight surgical knife used in dissection and surgery.
scissors	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy scissors from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>
<u>sharp</u>	Keenly and painfully felt as if caused by a sharp edge or point. A sharp pain.

sickle	A short-handled farming tool with a semicircular blade, used for cutting corn, lopping, or trimming.
