Shrill as an Adjective

Definitions of "Shrill" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "shrill" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of a voice or sound) high-pitched and piercing.
- Of colors that are bright and gaudy.
- (especially of a complaint or demand) loud and forceful.
- Having or emitting a high-pitched and sharp tone or tones.
