<b>yawp</b>	A harsh or hoarse cry or yelp. <i>The cur did not bark other than a single <b>yawp</b>.</i>
<b>yelp</b>	A short, sharp cry, especially of pain or alarm. <i>She uttered a <b>yelp</b> as she bumped into a table.</i>

<b>cry</b>	Utter a sudden loud cry. <i>She heard a voice <b>crying</b> her name.</i>

<b>squall</b>	Blow in a squall. <i>Sarah was <b>squalling</b> in her crib.</i>
<b>squawk</b>	Utter a harsh abrupt scream. <i>What are you doing she <b>squawked</b>.</i>
<b>wail</b>	Utter a wail. <i>The wind <b>wailed</b> and buffeted the timber structure.</i>
<b>yawp</b>	Talk foolishly or noisily. <i>The fans screeched <b>yawped</b> and pounded their palms.</i>
<b>yelp</b>	Utter a yelp. <i>My dog was <b>yelping</b> as if hurt.</i>

## Shrill as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Shrill" as an adjective

## Synonyms of "Shrill" as an adjective (14 Words)

<b>high</b>	Being at or having a relatively great or specific elevation or upward extension sometimes used in combinations like knee high. <i>A <b>high</b> incline.</i>
<b>high-pitched</b>	Set at a sharp or high angle or slant.
<b><u>intrusive</u></b>	Relating to or formed by intrusion. <i>That was an <b>intrusive</b> question.</i>
<b>loud</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>Her voice was too <b>loud</b>.</i>

<b>screechy</b>	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
<b><u>sharp</u></b>	Having or emitting a high pitched and sharp tone or tones. <i>His old mind was not so <b>sharp</b> as it once was.</i>
<b>shattering</b>	Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering. <i>The <b>shattering</b> tones of the enormous carillon.</i>
<b>shrieking</b>	Making a high-pitched piercing cry or sound. <i>A <b>shrieking</b> ambulance.</i>
<b>squawky</b>	Like the cackles or squawks a hen makes especially after laying an egg. <i>Their voices are high and birdlike and <b>squawky</b>.</i>
<b>strident</b>	Unpleasantly loud and harsh. <i><b>Strident</b> demands.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>His imagery made a <b>strong</b> impression on the critics.</i>

<b>fang</b>	The biting mouthpart of a spider. <i>The dog was bounding towards him its <b>fangs</b> bared.</i>
<b>howl</b>	Make a howling sound. <i><b>Howls</b> of laughter.</i>
<b>incisive</b>	(of an account) accurate and sharply focused. <i><b>Incisive</b> teeth.</i>
<b>insightful</b>	Exhibiting insight or clear and deep perception-R.C.Angell. <i>Thank you for all the <b>insightful</b> comments.</i>

<b>keen</b>	Having or showing eagerness or enthusiasm. <i><b>Keen</b> winds.</i>
<b>keenness</b>	A positive feeling of wanting to push ahead with something. <i>He has expressed his <b>keenness</b> to retain his job.</i>
<b>penetrating</b>	Having or demonstrating ability to recognize or draw fine distinctions. <i><b>Penetrating</b> insight.</i>
<b>perceptive</b>	Of or relating to perception. <i>A <b>perceptive</b> observation.</i>
<b><u>piercing</u></b>	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. <i>Two months ago I decided to take out all my <b>piercings</b>.</i>
<b>piquant</b>	Pleasantly stimulating or exciting to the mind. <i>A <b>piquant</b> tartare sauce.</i>
<b>pointed</b>	Direct and obvious in meaning or reference; often unpleasant. <i>A <b>pointed</b> allusion to what was going on.</i>
<b>projection</b>	The projection of an image from a film onto a screen. <i>The band use stage <b>projections</b> featuring moon shots.</i>
<b>pungent</b>	(of comment, criticism, or humour) having a sharp and caustic quality. <i>The <b>pungent</b> smell of frying onions.</i>
<b>scalpel</b>	A thin straight surgical knife used in dissection and surgery.
<b>scissors</b>	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy <b>scissors</b> from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>

<b>sickle</b>	A short-handled farming tool with a semicircular blade, used for cutting corn, lopping, or trimming.
