### Definitions of "Sibling" as a noun

## Synonyms of "Sibling" as a noun (2 Words)

**brother or sister** A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.

**sib** A brother or sister a sibling.

### [aunt](#)

An unrelated adult female friend, especially of a child.  
*She was brought up by her **aunt** and uncle.*

### [avuncular](#)

Kind and friendly towards a younger or less experienced person.  
*He was **avuncular** reassuring and trustworthy.*

### **beget**

(especially of a man) bring (a child) into existence by the process of reproduction.  
*Killings **beget** more killings.*

### **biological**

A substance of biological origin used as a drug vaccine pesticide etc.  
***Biological** child.*

### [brother](#)

A male with the same parents as someone else.  
*He recognized her from her strong resemblance to her **brother**.*

### [buddy](#)

A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.  
*I m working on it **buddy**.*

<b><u>comrade</u></b>	A fellow member of the Communist Party. <i>You re right <b>comrade</b>.</i>
<b>cousin</b>	A person in one's wider extended family, to whom one is not closely related. <i>Our American <b>cousins</b>.</i>
<b><u>crony</u></b>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<b><u>daughter</u></b>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and <b>daughters</b> of Adam.</i>
<b><u>elder</u></b>	An official in the early Christian Church, or of various Protestant Churches and sects. <i>Schoolchildren were no less fascinated than their <b>elders</b>.</i>
<b><u>familial</u></b>	Occurring among members of a family usually by heredity. <i>The <b>familial</b> Christmas dinner.</i>
<b>family</b>	A taxonomic group containing one or more genera. <i>All manuscripts that share this reading constitute a <b>family</b>.</i>
<b>father</b>	Appear as or admit that one is the father or originator of. <i>George Washington is the <b>father</b> of his country.</i>
<b>friend</b>	Befriend someone. <i>She was unsure whether he was <b>friend</b> or foe.</i>
<b>grandparent</b>	A parent of your father or mother. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe s <b>grandparents</b> living nearby.</i>
<b>kinsfolk</b>	People descended from a common ancestor.
<b>mate</b>	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>A male is <b>mated</b> to several females.</i>
<b><u>mother</u></b>	A woman who has given birth to a child also used as a term of address to your mother. <i>He found a beautiful wife that <b>mothered</b> his children.</i>
<b>nephew</b>	A son of your brother or sister.
<b>niece</b>	A daughter of one's brother or sister, or of one's brother-in-law or sister-in-law.
<b>offspring</b>	The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Industrialism prepared the way for acceptance of the French Revolution s various socialistic <b>offspring</b>.</i>
<b><u>parent</u></b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Some of the whetstones have been transported up to 400 km from the <b>parent</b> rock.</i>



<b><u>partner</u></b>	Associate or work together as partners. <i>Sexual <b>partners</b>.</i>
<b>procreate</b>	Have offspring or produce more individuals of a given animal or plant. <i>Species that <b>procreate</b> by copulation.</i>
<b><u>progeny</u></b>	The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their <b>progeny</b>.</i>
<b><u>sister</u></b>	Sometimes used as a term of address for attractive young women. <i>The <b>sisters</b> announced that there would be a special rosary every morning.</i>
<b>sisterhood</b>	An association or society of women who are linked together by a common religion or trade or interest. <i>Much of <b>sisterhood</b> is about sharing lipsticks.</i>
<b><u>twin</u></b>	Give birth to twins. <i>The <b>twin</b> problems of economic failure and social disintegration.</i>
<b>uncle</b>	The brother of one's father or mother or the husband of one's aunt. <i>He visited his <b>uncle</b>.</i>
