Definitions of "Sibling" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “sibling” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person's brother or sister.*
- *Each of two or more children or offspring having one or both parents in common; a brother or sister.*



Synonyms of "Sibling" as a noun (2 Words)

brother or sister A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.

sib A brother or sister a sibling.



Associations of "Sibling" (30 Words)

aunt

An unrelated adult female friend, especially of a child.
*She was brought up by her **aunt** and uncle.*

avuncular

Kind and friendly towards a younger or less experienced person.
*He was **avuncular** reassuring and trustworthy.*

beget

(especially of a man) bring (a child) into existence by the process of reproduction.
*Killings **beget** more killings.*

biological

A substance of biological origin used as a drug vaccine pesticide etc.
***Biological** child.*

brother

A male with the same parents as someone else.
*He recognized her from her strong resemblance to her **brother**.*

buddy

A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.
*I m working on it **buddy**.*

<u>comrade</u>	A fellow member of the Communist Party. <i>You re right comrade.</i>
cousin	A person in one's wider extended family, to whom one is not closely related. <i>Our American cousins.</i>
<u>crony</u>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and daughters of Adam.</i>
<u>elder</u>	An official in the early Christian Church, or of various Protestant Churches and sects. <i>Schoolchildren were no less fascinated than their elders.</i>
<u>familial</u>	Occurring among members of a family usually by heredity. <i>The familial Christmas dinner.</i>
family	A taxonomic group containing one or more genera. <i>All manuscripts that share this reading constitute a family.</i>
father	Appear as or admit that one is the father or originator of. <i>George Washington is the father of his country.</i>
friend	Befriend someone. <i>She was unsure whether he was friend or foe.</i>
grandparent	A parent of your father or mother. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe s grandparents living nearby.</i>
kinsfolk	People descended from a common ancestor.
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>A male is mated to several females.</i>
<u>mother</u>	A woman who has given birth to a child also used as a term of address to your mother. <i>He found a beautiful wife that mothered his children.</i>
nephew	A son of your brother or sister.
niece	A daughter of one's brother or sister, or of one's brother-in-law or sister-in-law.
offspring	The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Industrialism prepared the way for acceptance of the French Revolution s various socialistic offspring.</i>
<u>parent</u>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Some of the whetstones have been transported up to 400 km from the parent rock.</i>

- partner** Associate or work together as partners.
*Sexual **partners**.*
- procreate** Have offspring or produce more individuals of a given animal or plant.
*Species that **procreate** by copulation.*
- progeny** The immediate descendants of a person.
*Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their **progeny**.*
- sister** Sometimes used as a term of address for attractive young women.
*The **sisters** announced that there would be a special rosary every morning.*
- sisterhood** An association or society of women who are linked together by a common religion or trade or interest.
*Much of **sisterhood** is about sharing lipsticks.*
- twin** Give birth to twins.
*The **twin** problems of economic failure and social disintegration.*
- uncle** The brother of one's father or mother or the husband of one's aunt.
*He visited his **uncle**.*
