- *Causing great annoyance or disappointment.*

<b>abominable</b>	Unequivocally detestable- Edmund Burke. <i>What an <b>abominable</b> mess.</i>
<b><u>appalling</u></b>	Very bad; awful. <i>The cat suffered <b>appalling</b> injuries during the attack.</i>
<b>awful</b>	(of a person) very unwell or troubled. <i>I ve made an <b>awful</b> fool of myself.</i>
<b><u>disagreeable</u></b>	Unfriendly and bad-tempered. <i>Aspects of his work are <b>disagreeable</b> to him.</i>

<b>disgusting</b>	Arousing revulsion or strong indignation. <i>He had the most <b>disgusting</b> rotten teeth.</i>
<b>distasteful</b>	Causing dislike or aversion; disagreeable or unpleasant. <i>He found such cynicism <b>distasteful</b>.</i>
<b>dreadful</b>	Extremely disagreeable. <i>Don't go out the weather is <b>dreadful</b>.</i>
<b>foul</b>	Of a baseball not hit between the foul lines. <i><b>Foul</b> oaths.</i>
<b>hideous</b>	Extremely unpleasant. <i>The whole <b>hideous</b> story.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b>loathsome</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>A <b>loathsome</b> disease.</i>
<b>nasty</b>	(of the weather) unpleasantly cold or wet. <i>A <b>nasty</b> problem.</i>
<b>nauseating</b>	Causing or liable to cause a feeling of nausea or disgust; disgusting. <i>The stench was <b>nauseating</b>.</i>
<b>nauseous</b>	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>The smell was <b>nauseous</b>.</i>
<b>noisome</b>	Offensively malodorous. <i>A <b>noisome</b> concoction of which cheap port is the basis.</i>
<b>objectionable</b>	Liable to objection or debate; used of something one might take exception to. <i>A vulgar and <b>objectionable</b> person.</i>
<b>obnoxious</b>	Extremely unpleasant. <i>He found her son somewhat <b>obnoxious</b>.</i>
<b>off-putting</b>	Tending to repel- Elizabeth Hess.
<b>offensive</b>	Morally offensive. <i><b>Offensive</b> odors.</i>
<b>queasy</b>	Nauseous; feeling sick. <i>The <b>queasy</b> swell of the boat.</i>
<b>repellent</b>	Serving or tending to repel. <i>A water <b>repellent</b> fabric.</i>
<b>repugnant</b>	Extremely distasteful; unacceptable. <i>Cannibalism seems <b>repugnant</b> to us.</i>

<b>repulsive</b>	Relating to repulsion between physical objects. <i>A <b>repulsive</b> smell.</i>
<b>revolting</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i><b>Revolting</b> food.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A <b>terrible</b> crime.</i>
<b>uninviting</b>	Neither attractive nor tempting. <i>The house was dark and <b>uninviting</b>.</i>
<b>vile</b>	Morally reprehensible. <i>He has a <b>vile</b> temper.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Sickening" as an adjective

- *A sickening stench.*
- *She hit the ground with a sickening thud.*
- *It is sickening to think we had done enough to win and then had to leave with nothing.*
- *A sickening stench of blood.*

<b>detestable</b>	Unequivocally detestable. <i>I found the film s violence <b>detestable</b>.</i>
<b>disgusting</b>	Arousing revulsion or strong indignation. <i>He had the most <b>disgusting</b> rotten teeth.</i>
<b>displeasing</b>	Causing displeasure or lacking pleasing qualities. <i>It was not entirely <b>displeasing</b> to be the centre of such a drama.</i>
<b>fetid</b>	Smelling extremely unpleasant. <i>The <b>fetid</b> water of the marsh.</i>
<b>foul</b>	Make foul or dirty pollute. <i>Will have to work towards solutions to prevent trucks from <b>fouling</b> railroad tracks.</i>
<b>hate</b>	Have a strong aversion to (something). <i>I <b>hate</b> to bother you.</i>
<b>hateful</b>	Evoking or deserving hatred- Joseph Priestly. <i>That <b>hateful</b> arrogant woman.</i>
<b>horrifying</b>	Causing horror; extremely shocking. <i>An alarming even <b>horrifying</b> picture.</i>

<b>loathsome</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>This <b>loathsome</b> little swine.</i>
<b><u>nausea</u></b>	The state that precedes vomiting. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public <b>nausea</b> and outrage.</i>
<b>nauseating</b>	Causing or liable to cause a feeling of nausea or disgust; disgusting. <i>The stench was <b>nauseating</b>.</i>
<b>nauseous</b>	Affected with nausea; feeling inclined to vomit. <i><b>Nauseous</b> offal.</i>
<b>noisome</b>	Having an extremely offensive smell. <i><b>Noisome</b> vapours from the smouldering waste.</i>
<b>noxious</b>	Harmful, poisonous, or very unpleasant. <i><b>Noxious</b> ideas.</i>
<b>offensive</b>	Morally offensive. <i><b>Offensive</b> odors.</i>
<b>queasy</b>	Inducing a feeling of nausea. <i>The <b>queasy</b> swell of the boat.</i>
<b>repellent</b>	Incapable of absorbing or mixing with. <i>Water <b>repellent</b> nylon.</i>
<b>repelling</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust.
<b>repugnant</b>	In conflict or incompatible with. <i>A by law must not be <b>repugnant</b> to the general law of the country.</i>
<b>repulsive</b>	Offensive to the mind. <i>A <b>repulsive</b> force.</i>
<b>revulsion</b>	A sense of disgust and loathing. <i>News of the attack will be met with sorrow and <b>revulsion</b>.</i>
<b>stinking</b>	Very bad. <i>A <b>stinking</b> cold.</i>
<b><u>unhealthy</u></b>	Not conducive to good health. <i>An <b>unhealthy</b> diet of fast foods.</i>
<b>unsightly</b>	Unpleasant to look at. <i><b>Unsightly</b> billboards.</i>
<b>unwholesome</b>	Detrimental to physical or moral well-being. <i>The use of the living room as sleeping quarters led to <b>unwholesome</b> crowding.</i>
<b>vile</b>	Morally reprehensible. <i><b>Vile</b> smells.</i>

worse

Changed for the worse in health or fitness.  
*The small department was already stretched to the limit but **worse** was to follow.*
