### Definitions of "Sidekick" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “sidekick” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.*
- *A person's assistant or close associate, especially one who has less authority than that person.*



## Synonyms of "Sidekick" as a noun (25 Words)

### ally

A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose.

*He s a good **ally** in fight.*

### associate

A person who joins with others in some activity or endeavor.

*First was the lightning and then its thunderous **associate**.*

### best friend

The person who is most outstanding or excellent; someone who tops all others.

**boon companion** A desirable state.

### bosom friend

Cloth that covers the chest or breasts.

### brother

A male with the same parents as someone else.

*The time is coming **brothers** for us to act.*

### buddy

A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.

*I m working on it **buddy**.*

<b>chum</b>	A close friend. <i>An old school <b>chum</b>.</i>
<b>classmate</b>	An acquaintance that you go to school with.
<b>close friend</b>	The temporal end; the concluding time.
<u><b>companion</b></u>	A person who shares the experiences of another, especially when these are unpleasant or unwelcome. <i>His travelling <b>companion</b>.</i>
<u><b>comrade</b></u>	A fellow soldier or member of the armed forces. <i>Greetings <b>comrade</b>.</i>
<u><b>confidant</b></u>	A person with whom one shares a secret or private matter, trusting them not to repeat it to others. <i>A close <b>confidante</b> of the princess.</i>
<b>confidante</b>	A female confidant.
<u><b>crony</b></u>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his <b>cronies</b>.</i>
<u><b>familiar</b></u>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) a person rendering certain services in a pope's or bishop's household. <i>Her <b>familiars</b> were her two little griffons that nested in her skirts.</i>
<b>intimate</b>	Someone to whom private matters are confided. <i>His circle of <b>intimates</b>.</i>
<u><b>pal</b></u>	Used as a form of address, especially to indicate anger or aggression. <i>We've been <b>pals</b> for a long time.</i>
<b>playfellow</b>	A companion at play. <i>They had been his boyhood <b>playfellows</b>.</i>
<b>playmate</b>	Used euphemistically to refer to a person's lover. <i>Her clients use this album of photos to pick their ideal <b>playmate</b>.</i>
<b>schoolmate</b>	A person who attends or attended the same school as oneself. <i>I ran into an old <b>schoolmate</b> of mine.</i>
<b>second self</b>	1/60 of a minute; the basic unit of time adopted under the Systeme International d'Unites.
<u><b>shadow</b></u>	The slightest trace of something. <i>Trees cast long <b>shadows</b>.</i>
<b>soul mate</b>	The human embodiment of something.
<b>workmate</b>	A fellow worker.
