- *A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.*
- *A person's assistant or close associate, especially one who has less authority than that person.*



Synonyms of "Sidekick" as a noun (25 Words)

ally	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He s a good ally in fight.</i>
associate	A person who joins with others in some activity or endeavor. <i>First was the lightning and then its thunderous associate.</i>
best friend	The person who is most outstanding or excellent; someone who tops all others.
boon companion	A desirable state.
bosom friend	Cloth that covers the chest or breasts.
brother	A male with the same parents as someone else. <i>The time is coming brothers for us to act.</i>
buddy	A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities. <i>I m working on it buddy.</i>

chum	A close friend. <i>An old school chum.</i>
classmate	An acquaintance that you go to school with.
close friend	The temporal end; the concluding time.
<u>companion</u>	A person who shares the experiences of another, especially when these are unpleasant or unwelcome. <i>His travelling companion.</i>
<u>comrade</u>	A fellow soldier or member of the armed forces. <i>Greetings comrade.</i>
<u>confidant</u>	A person with whom one shares a secret or private matter, trusting them not to repeat it to others. <i>A close confidante of the princess.</i>
confidante	A female confidant.
<u>crony</u>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<u>familiar</u>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) a person rendering certain services in a pope's or bishop's household. <i>Her familiars were her two little griffons that nested in her skirts.</i>
intimate	Someone to whom private matters are confided. <i>His circle of intimates.</i>
<u>pal</u>	Used as a form of address, especially to indicate anger or aggression. <i>We ve been pals for a long time.</i>
playfellow	A companion at play. <i>They had been his boyhood playfellows.</i>
playmate	Used euphemistically to refer to a person's lover. <i>Her clients use this album of photos to pick their ideal playmate.</i>
schoolmate	A person who attends or attended the same school as oneself. <i>I ran into an old schoolmate of mine.</i>
second self	1/60 of a minute; the basic unit of time adopted under the Systeme International d'Unites.
<u>shadow</u>	The slightest trace of something. <i>Trees cast long shadows.</i>
soul mate	The human embodiment of something.
workmate	A fellow worker.
