comrade A fellow soldier or member of the armed forces.

Greetings **comrade**.

A person with whom one shares a secret or private matter, trusting

A close **confidant**e of the princess.

confidante A female confidant.

A close friend or companion.

He went gambling with his cronies.

(in the Roman Catholic Church) a person rendering certain services in a

familiar pope's or bishop's household.

Her **familiar**s were her two little griffons that nested in her skirts.

intimate Someone to whom private matters are confided.

His circle of **intimate**s.

Used as a form of address, especially to indicate anger or aggression.

We ve been **pal**s for a long time.

playfellow A companion at play.

They had been his boyhood **playfellow**s.

playmate Used euphemistically to refer to a person's lover.

Her clients use this album of photos to pick their ideal **playmate**.

schoolmate A person who attends or attended the same school as oneself.

I ran into an old **schoolmate** of mine.

second self 1/60 of a minute; the basic unit of time adopted under the Systeme

International d'Unites.

The slightest trace of something.

Trees cast long **shadow**s.

soul mate The human embodiment of something.

workmate A fellow worker.
