angry	(of the sea or sky) stormy, turbulent, or threatening. <i>I m angry that she didn t call me.</i>
appeasing	Intended to pacify by acceding to demands or granting concessions. <i>The appeasing concessions to the Nazis at Munich.</i>
asleep	Dead. <i>Were all asleep when the phone rang.</i>
calming	The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of. Affording comfort or solace.
comforting	<i>We would like to thank our family and friends for their support and their comforting words.</i>
conciliatory	Intended to placate. <i>A conciliatory visit.</i>
croak	Of a person make a sound similar to a croak when speaking or laughing. <i>Thank you I croaked.</i>
dormancy	The state in which a plant is alive but not actively growing. <i>The volcano erupted after centuries of dormancy.</i>
drowse	Be sluggish or inactive. <i>Let not your prudence drowse.</i>
drowsy	Showing lack of attention or boredom. <i>A drowsy suburb called Surrey Hills.</i>
exasperated	Greatly annoyed; out of patience. <i>As the students exit an exasperated teacher tries in vain to get their attention.</i>
exhausted	Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted. <i>Exhausted oil wells.</i>
groan	(of an object) make a low creaking sound when pressure or weight is applied. <i>Oh no I groaned.</i>

growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The dogs yapped and growled at his heels.</i>
guttural	A guttural consonant e g k g or other speech sound. <i>His parents guttural central European accent.</i>
moan	A sound resembling a human moan. <i>My friend always moans that I never make her a cake.</i>
placating	Intended to pacify by acceding to demands or granting concessions. <i>Placating or placative gestures.</i>
reassuring	Serving or intended to remove someone's doubts or fears. <i>The news is very reassuring.</i>
relaxation	The exponential return of a system to equilibrium after a disturbance. <i>His favourite form of relaxation was reading detective novels.</i>
repose	The absence of mental stress or anxiety. <i>The diamond now reposes in the Louvre.</i>
respite	Grant a respite to someone especially a person condemned to death. <i>Some poor criminal from the gibbet or the wheel respited for a day.</i>
rest	Put something in a resting position as for support or steadying. <i>She was an actress but doing domestic work while she was resting.</i>
shaking	The act of causing something to move up and down (or back and forth) with quick movements. <i>The shaking of his fingers as he lit his pipe.</i>
shriek	A high-pitched piercing cry or sound; a scream. <i>She was shrieking abuse at a taxi.</i>
sick	People who are sick. <i>Mark felt sick with fear.</i>
sickness	The state of being ill. <i>Drugs have become a sickness they cannot cure.</i>
soothing	Affording physical relief. <i>She put on some soothing music.</i>
tired	Depleted of strength or energy. <i>Fisher rubbed his tired eyes.</i>
tranquility	An untroubled state; free from disturbances.
wearied	Exhausted.
