Associations of "Sighed" (30 Words)

angry	As if showing violent anger. <i>Christine had made him angry.</i>
choleric	Easily moved to anger- H.G.Wells. <i>A choleric disposition.</i>
croak	Of a person make a sound similar to a croak when speaking or laughing. <i>Without croaking it may be observed that our government is upon a dangerous experiment.</i>
enraged	Marked by extreme anger. <i>The enraged bull attacked.</i>
exasperated	Greatly annoyed; out of patience. <i>An exasperated expression.</i>
furious	As if showing violent anger. <i>Furious winds.</i>
furiously	In an extremely angry manner. <i>Charlie pedalled furiously for six miles.</i>
fury	Wild or violent anger. <i>Tears of fury and frustration.</i>
groan	Be oppressed by. <i>They were moaning and groaning about management.</i>
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The growl of diesel engines.</i>
guttural	A guttural consonant e g k g or other speech sound. <i>Acres of guttural frogs.</i>
indignant	Angered at something unjust or wrong. <i>He was indignant at being the object of suspicion.</i>
infuriated	Marked by extreme anger. <i>Infuriated onlookers charged the police who were beating the boy.</i>

irascible	Characterized by anger. <i>An irascible response.</i>
irate	Feeling or showing extreme anger. <i>Irate protesters.</i>
ire	Belligerence aroused by a real or supposed wrong (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>The plans provoked the ire of conservationists.</i>
irritated	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>The irritated look on Alec's face.</i>
moan	Make a sound resembling a human moan. <i>The foghorn moaned at intervals.</i>
mood	The atmosphere or pervading tone of something. <i>The national mood had changed radically since the last election.</i>
outraged	Angered at something unjust or wrong. <i>A look of outraged disbelief.</i>
rage	A feeling of intense anger. <i>It was all the rage that season.</i>
rancor	A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.
resentful	Feeling or expressing bitterness or indignation at having been treated unfairly. <i>A sullen resentful attitude.</i>
scowl	An angry or bad-tempered expression. <i>She stamped into the room with a scowl on her face.</i>
shaking	The act of causing something to move up and down (or back and forth) with quick movements. <i>The shaking of his fingers as he lit his pipe.</i>
shriek	(of something inanimate) make a high-pitched screeching sound. <i>Shrieks of laughter.</i>
sick	People who are sick. <i>The company organized a sick fund for its workers.</i>
snarl	An act or sound of snarling. <i>The guard snarled at us.</i>
tired	In need of sleep or rest; weary. <i>I have to look after these animals when you get tired of them.</i>
wrath	Intense anger (usually on an epic scale). <i>He hid his pipe for fear of incurring his father's wrath.</i>
