## Signature as a Noun

### Definitions of "Signature" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “signature” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The part of a medical prescription that gives instructions about the use of the medicine or drug prescribed.*
- *Your name written in your own handwriting.*
- *A melody used to identify a performer or a dance band or radio/tv program.*
- *A distinguishing style.*
- *A distinctive pattern, product, or characteristic by which someone or something can be identified.*
- *The action of signing a document.*
- *A printed sheet after being folded to form a group of pages.*
- *A letter or figure printed at the foot of one or more pages of each sheet of a book as a guide in binding.*
- *The sharps or flats that follow the clef and indicate the key.*
- *A person's name written in a distinctive way as a form of identification in authorizing a cheque or document or concluding a letter.*
- *A sheet with several pages printed on it; it folds to page size and is bound with other*

*signatures to form a book.*



## Synonyms of "Signature" as a noun (14 Words)

- address** A binary number that identifies a particular location in a data storage system or computer memory.  
*He failed in his manner of **address** to the captain.*
- autograph** A person's own signature.  
*Fans surged around the car asking for **autographs**.*
- cross** A staff surmounted by a cross carried in religious processions and on ceremonial occasions before an archbishop.  
*A mule is a **cross** between a horse and a donkey.*
- dedication** A short message (as in a book or musical work or on a photograph) dedicating it to someone or something.  
*His **dedication** to his duties.*

<b><u>imprint</u></b>	A brand name under which books are published, typically the name of a former publishing house that is now part of a larger group. <i>The group will continue to market its products through its established <b>imprints</b>.</i>
<b>initials</b>	The first letter of a word (especially a person's name). <i>He refused to put the <b>initials</b> FRS after his name.</i>
<b>key signature</b>	United States lawyer and poet who wrote a poem after witnessing the British attack on Baltimore during the War of 1812; the poem was later set to music and entitled 'The Star-Spangled Banner' (1779-1843).
<b>message</b>	A communication from a prophet or preacher, believed to be inspired by God. <i>He would run those interminable <b>messages</b> after school to the bookie.</i>
<b>scribble</b>	An aimless drawing. <i>The postman would never be able to decipher your <b>scribble</b>.</i>
<b>signature tune</b>	A distinguishing style.
<b>squiggle</b>	An illegible scrawl. <i>His signature was just a <b>squiggle</b> but only he could make that <b>squiggle</b>.</i>
<b>theme song</b>	Melodic subject of a musical composition.
<b>touch</b>	An act of touching someone or something. <i>Later he showed a surer political <b>touch</b>.</i>
<b>x</b>	Street names for methylenedioxymethamphetamine.

## Associations of "Signature" (30 Words)

<b>accede</b>	Assume an office or position. <i>By now John had died and Henry III had <b>acceded</b>.</i>
<b>acquiescence</b>	The reluctant acceptance of something without protest. <i>A murmur of <b>acquiescence</b> from the assembly.</i>
<b>assent</b>	The expression of approval or agreement. <i>The Maestro <b>assented</b> to the request for an encore.</i>
<b>autograph</b>	A signature, especially that of a celebrity written as a memento for an admirer. <i>The whole team <b>autographed</b> a shirt for him.</i>
<b>brand</b>	A brand name. <i>We ll have the ability to market and <b>brand</b> our own product.</i>
<b>caret</b>	A mark ( ^, □ ) placed below the line to indicate a proposed insertion in a text.

<b><u>celebrity</u></b>	The state of being well known. <i>He was a baseball <b>celebrity</b>.</i>
<b><u>consent</u></b>	Agree to do something. <i>No change may be made without the <b>consent</b> of all the partners.</i>
<b><u>cursive</u></b>	Rapid handwriting in which letters are set down in full and are cursively connected within words without lifting the writing implement from the paper. <i>This style of writing began to compete with Gothic <b>cursive</b>.</i>
<b><u>dignitary</u></b>	A person considered to be important because of high rank or office. <i>I presented bouquets to visiting dignitaries at my prep school.</i>
<b><u>emblazon</u></b>	Depict (a heraldic device) on something. <i>T shirts <b>emblazoned</b> with the names of baseball teams.</i>
<b><u>emblem</u></b>	Special design or visual object representing a quality, type, group, etc. <i>Our child would be a dazzling <b>emblem</b> of our love.</i>
<b><u>eminence</u></b>	High status importance owing to marked superiority. <i>A scholar of great <b>eminence</b>.</i>
<b><u>enroll</u></b>	Register formally as a participant or member.
<b><u>enter</u></b>	Set out on an enterprise or subject of study. <i>The horse was <b>entered</b> in the Martell Cup at Aintree.</i>
<b><u>handwriting</u></b>	Writing with a pen or pencil. <i>She recognized his <b>handwriting</b>.</i>
<b><u>inscribe</u></b>	Mark with one's signature. <i>A regular polygon <b>inscribed</b> in a circle.</i>
<b><u>logo</u></b>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic <b>logo</b> was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
<b><u>mascot</u></b>	A character, animal or object that is adopted by a team or group as a symbolic figure. <i>The team's dolphin <b>mascot</b>.</i>
<b><u>memorandum</u></b>	A written proposal or reminder. <i>The two countries signed a <b>memorandum</b> of understanding on economic cooperation.</i>
<b><u>name</u></b>	Give a name to. <i>She was <b>named</b> Head of the Committee.</i>
<b><u>prominence</u></b>	The state of being important, famous, or noticeable. <i>Radiographs showed enlargement of the right heart with <b>prominence</b> of the pulmonary outflow tract.</i>

<b>renown</b>	The state or quality of being widely honored and acclaimed. <i>Authors of great <b>renown</b>.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>The flower <b>represents</b> a young girl.</i>
<b>scribble</b>	An aimless drawing. <i>He took the clipboard and <b>scribbled</b> something illegible.</i>
<b>slogan</b>	A motto associated with a political party or movement or other group. <i>Students were chanting <b>slogans</b>.</i>
<b><u>symbolic</u></b>	Significant purely in terms of what is being represented or implied. <i><b>Symbolic</b> operations.</i>
<b><u>trademark</u></b>	Mark with a brand or trademark. <i>She filed a request with the government to <b>trademark</b> her company's name.</i>
<b><u>write</u></b>	Underwrite an insurance policy. <i>Thank you and goodbye I'll <b>write</b> soon.</i>
<b><u>yes</u></b>	An affirmative. <i>I was hoping for a <b>yes</b>.</i>
