Definitions of "Signifies" as a verb

- *Denote or connote.*
- *Make known with a word or signal.*
- *Convey or express a meaning.*

Synonyms of "Signifies" as a verb (3 Words)

- intend** Mean or intend to express or convey.
*What do his words **intend**.*
- mean** Mean or intend to express or convey.
*What do you **mean** by leaving me out here in the cold.*
- stand for** Put into an upright position.

Usage Examples of "Signifies" as a verb

- *What does his strange behavior signify?*

Associations of "Signifies" (30 Words)

allude	Suggest or call attention to indirectly; hint at. <i>He alluded to the problem but did not mention it.</i>
asterisk	Mark with an asterisk. <i>He had asterisked the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
bespeak	Be a signal for or a symptom of. <i>The defendant's insurers took steps to bespeak his medical records.</i>
cue	Give a cue to or for. <i>She had not yet been given her cue to come out on to the dais.</i>
denotation	The most direct or specific meaning of a word or expression; the class of objects that an expression refers to. <i>Beyond their immediate denotation the words have a connotative power.</i>
denote	Stand as a name or symbol for. <i>She denoted her feelings clearly.</i>
express	By express. <i>An express train.</i>
figuratively	Used to indicate a departure from a literal use of words; metaphorically. <i>I did bump into figuratively speaking quite a few interesting people.</i>
gesticulate	Show, express or direct through movement. <i>They were shouting and gesticulating frantically at drivers who did not slow down.</i>
hint	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>The restrained fronts of the terraced houses only hinted at the wealth within.</i>
imply	Express or state indirectly. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i>
index	Provide an index to. <i>The pins are retracted and indexed to occupy an adjacent slotted position.</i>
indicant	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indicate	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>His tone indicated that he didn't hold out much hope.</i>
indication	(medicine) a reason to prescribe a drug or perform a procedure. <i>An indication of foul play.</i>
insinuate	Give to understand. <i>I insinuated that I did not like his wife.</i>

<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>No offence was intended I assure you.</i>
<u>logo</u>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
<u>manifestation</u>	Expression without words. <i>A characteristic manifestation of Lyme disease.</i>
mean	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>We were meant to go over yesterday.</i>
overtone	A component of any oscillation whose frequency is an integral multiple of the fundamental frequency. <i>The decision may have political overtones.</i>
portend	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>The eclipses portend some major events.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>The flower represents a young girl.</i>
sign	A gesture used in a system of sign language. <i>He signed his disapproval with a dismissive hand gesture.</i>
signal	Communicate silently and non verbally by signals or signs. <i>The champion's announcement that he was retiring was the signal for scores of journalists to gather at his last match.</i>
specifier	Someone who draws up specifications giving details (as for obtaining a patent).
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical symbol for helium is He.</i>
<u>symbolic</u>	Involving the use of symbols or symbolism. <i>Symbolic operations.</i>
symptom	Anything that accompanies X and is regarded as an indication of X's existence. <i>The government was plagued by leaks a symptom of divisions and poor morale.</i>
zodiac	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
