allude Suggest or call attention to indirectly; hint at.

He **allude**d to the problem but did not mention it.

Mark with an asterisk.

asterisk

Give a cue to or for.

She had not yet been given her **cue** to come out on to the dais.

The most direct or specific meaning of a word or expression; the class of
