## Signifies as a Verb

### Definitions of "Signifies" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “signifies” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Denote or connote.*
- *Make known with a word or signal.*
- *Convey or express a meaning.*

### Synonyms of "Signifies" as a verb (3 Words)

<b><u>intend</u></b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>What do his words <b>intend</b>.</i>
<b>mean</b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>What do you <b>mean</b> by leaving me out here in the cold.</i>
<b>stand for</b>	Put into an upright position.

### Usage Examples of "Signifies" as a verb

- *What does his strange behavior signify?*

## Associations of "Signifies" (30 Words)

<b><u>allude</u></b>	Suggest or call attention to indirectly; hint at. <i>He <b>alluded</b> to the problem but did not mention it.</i>
<b><u>asterisk</u></b>	Mark with an asterisk. <i>He had <b>asterisked</b> the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<b>bespeak</b>	Be a signal for or a symptom of. <i>The defendant's insurers took steps to <b>bespeak</b> his medical records.</i>
<b>cue</b>	Give a cue to or for. <i>She had not yet been given her <b>cue</b> to come out on to the dais.</i>
<b>denotation</b>	The most direct or specific meaning of a word or expression; the class of objects that an expression refers to. <i>Beyond their immediate <b>denotation</b> the words have a connotative power.</i>
<b><u>denote</u></b>	Stand as a name or symbol for. <i>She <b>denoted</b> her feelings clearly.</i>
<b>express</b>	By express. <i>An <b>express</b> train.</i>
<b>figuratively</b>	Used to indicate a departure from a literal use of words; metaphorically. <i>I did bump into <b>figuratively</b> speaking quite a few interesting people.</i>
<b>gesticulate</b>	Show, express or direct through movement. <i>They were shouting and gesticulating frantically at drivers who did not slow down.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>The restrained fronts of the terraced houses only <b>hinted</b> at the wealth within.</i>
<b><u>imply</u></b>	Express or state indirectly. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b><u>index</u></b>	Provide an index to. <i>The pins are retracted and <b>indexed</b> to occupy an adjacent slotted position.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indicate</b>	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>His tone <b>indicated</b> that he didn't hold out much hope.</i>
<b>indication</b>	(medicine) a reason to prescribe a drug or perform a procedure. <i>An <b>indication</b> of foul play.</i>
<b><u>insinuate</u></b>	Give to understand. <i>I <b>insinuated</b> that I did not like his wife.</i>

<b><u>intend</u></b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>No offence was <b>intended</b> I assure you.</i>
<b><u>logo</u></b>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic <b>logo</b> was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
<b><u>manifestation</u></b>	Expression without words. <i>A characteristic <b>manifestation</b> of Lyme disease.</i>
<b>mean</b>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>We were <b>meant</b> to go over yesterday.</i>
<b>overtone</b>	A component of any oscillation whose frequency is an integral multiple of the fundamental frequency. <i>The decision may have political <b>overtones</b>.</i>
<b>portend</b>	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>The eclipses <b>portend</b> some major events.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>The flower <b>represents</b> a young girl.</i>
<b>sign</b>	A gesture used in a system of sign language. <i>He <b>signed</b> his disapproval with a dismissive hand gesture.</i>
<b>signal</b>	Communicate silently and non verbally by signals or signs. <i>The champion's announcement that he was retiring was the <b>signal</b> for scores of journalists to gather at his last match.</i>
<b>specifier</b>	Someone who draws up specifications giving details (as for obtaining a patent).
<b><u>symbol</u></b>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical <b>symbol</b> for helium is He.</i>
<b><u>symbolic</u></b>	Involving the use of symbols or symbolism. <i><b>Symbolic</b> operations.</i>
<b>symptom</b>	Anything that accompanies X and is regarded as an indication of X's existence. <i>The government was plagued by leaks a <b>symptom</b> of divisions and poor morale.</i>
<b>zodiac</b>	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
