- An outline of a solid object (as cast by its shadow.







<u>shape</u>	The state of good health especially in the phrases in condition or in shape or out of condition or out of shape. <i>He saw a shape through the mist.</i>

- Represent by a silhouette.
- Project on a background, such as a screen, like a silhouette.

gangly	Tall and thin.
<u>glum</u>	Showing a brooding ill humor- Bruce Bli. A glum hopeless shrug.
gray	English radiobiologist in whose honor the gray the SI unit of energy for the absorbed dose of radiation was named 1905 1965. <i>Gray flannel suit.</i>
grey	Showing characteristics of age especially having grey or white hair. <i>A cold grey November day.</i>
lissom	Moving and bending with ease. The kind of outfit that should be left to lissom teenagers.
<u>lithe</u>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. She lay gazing up at his tall lithe figure.
magenta	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. Bright pink double flowers each lined in dark magenta .
maroon	Leave stranded on a desert island without resources. The mutinous sailors were maroon ed on an island.
narrow	Make or become more narrow or restricted. <i>The gap between the sexes is narrowing.</i>
<u>slender</u>	Being of delicate or slender build. <i>Her slender neck.</i>
slim	A course or period of slimming. A slim chance of winning.
stygian	Hellish- Milton.

swarthy	Naturally having skin of a dark color. A smile on his swarthy face.
<u>thin</u>	Make thin or thinner. A thin book.
thinness	The quality of a liquid substance not containing much solid. <i>The thinness of the paper.</i>
tiny	A very young child. A tiny hummingbird.
waif	A young person who is thin and looks unhealthy or uncared for.
