silver grey	Silverware eating utensils.
silver medal	A soft white precious univalent metallic element having the highest electrical and thermal conductivity of any metal; occurs in argentite and in free form; used in coins and jewelry and tableware and photography.
silver plate	Silverware eating utensils.
silverware	Dishes, containers, or cutlery made of or coated with silver, or made of a material resembling silver.
specie	Money in the form of coins rather than notes. The Bank of England in 1795 had held around 8 million in <b>specie</b> .






### Usage Examples of "Silver" as a noun

## Silver as a Verb

#### Definitions of "Silver" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "silver" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- (especially of the moon) give a silvery appearance to.
- Make silver in color.
- (of a person's hair) turn grey or white.
- Turn (a person's hair) grey or white.
- Coat with a layer of silver or a silver amalgam.
- Coat or plate with silver.
- Provide (mirror glass) with a backing of a silver-coloured material in order to make it reflective.
- Turn silver.





## Synonyms of "Silver" as a verb (5 Words)

back with silver	Shift to a counterclockwise direction.
coat with silver	Put a coat on; cover the surface of; furnish with a surface.
laminate with silver Split (wood) into thin sheets.	
overlay with silver	Turn silver.
plate with silver	Coat with a layer of metal.

- The man's hair silvered very attractively.






## Silver as an Adjective

#### Definitions of "Silver" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "silver" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Having the white lustrous sheen of silver.
- Made from or largely consisting of silver.
- *Of lustrous grey; covered with or tinged with the color of silver.*
- Made of or coloured like silver.
- Expressing yourself readily, clearly, effectively.

argent	Silver; silvery white. <i>The <b>argent</b> moon</i> .
eloquent	Clearly expressing or indicating something. The bus journey alone is <b>eloquent</b> of class inequality.
<u>facile</u>	Arrived at without due care or effort; lacking depth. A man of <b>facile</b> and shallow intellect.
<u>fluent</u>	Able to express oneself easily and articulately. A <b>fluent</b> discharge from the nose.
silver-tongued	Expressing yourself readily, clearly, effectively.
silverish	Of lustrous grey; covered with or tinged with the color of silver.
silvern	Resembling or reminiscent of silver. A land of silver or <b>silvern</b> rivers where the salmon leap.

bronze	Of the color of bronze. The doors were <b>bronze</b> d with sculpted reliefs.
bullion	Gold or silver in bars or ingots. <i>Bullion</i> cords.
carat	A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats. <i>22 <b>carat</b> gold.</i>
<u>diamond</u>	One of the four suits in a conventional pack of playing cards denoted by a red diamond. <i>Fred s a <b>diamond</b></i> .
drachma	A former monetary unit of Greece, notionally equal to 100 lepta, replaced in 2002 by the euro.



earthenware	Pottery made of clay fired to a porous state which can be made impervious to liquids by the use of a glaze. <i>An earthenware jug.</i>
filigree	Make filigree as with a precious metal. Pine needles draped with a delicate <b>filigree</b> of mist.
gemstone	A crystalline rock that can be cut and polished for jewelry.
gild	A formal association of people with similar interests. In 1436 he <b>gild</b> ed and painted statues for Bruges Town Hall.
<u>gold</u>	An alloy of gold. The warm <b>gold</b> interior of the wood lined church.
jewellery	Personal ornaments, such as necklaces, rings, or bracelets, that are typically made from or contain jewels and precious metal. <i>A jewellery</i> box.
<u>jewelry</u>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems.
medallion	A piece of jewellery in the shape of a medal, worn as a pendant. <i>Medallions of veal.</i>
miner	A person who works in a mine. The <b>miner</b> s were freed after spending four days trapped underground.
mineral	Of or denoting a mineral. A wide range of necessary vitamins and <b>mineral</b> s.
mineshaft	Excavation consisting of a vertical or sloping passageway for finding or mining ore or for ventilating a mine. One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused <b>mineshaft</b> .
nephrite	A hard, pale green or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of calcium and magnesium.
nickel	Coat with nickel. We will see gasoline prices go up about a <b>nickel</b> .
nitrate	Any compound containing the nitrate group such as a salt or ester of nitric acid. <i>Nitrated polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons.</i>
pearl	A very pale bluish grey or white colour like that of a pearl. Raindrops <b>pearl</b> ed on water soaked windowpanes.
platinum	Greyish white or silvery like platinum. A <b>platinum</b> wig.



porcelain	An article made of porcelain. A collection of Chinese <b>porcelain</b> .
precious	Of high worth or cost. Diamonds sapphires rubies and emeralds are <b>precious</b> stones.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
rhinestone	An imitation diamond made from rock crystal or glass or paste. <i>Rhinestone earrings</i> .
silverware	Dishes, containers, or cutlery made of or coated with silver, or made of a material resembling silver.
spoon	A pair of spoons held in the hand and beaten together rhythmically as a percussion instrument. <b>Spoon</b> the sauce over the roast.
tableware	Articles for use at the table (dishes and silverware and glassware.
utensil	An implement for practical use (especially in a household. <i>Kitchen <b>utensil</b>s.</i>
