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Associations of "Simple minded" (30 Words)

artless	Without effort or pretentiousness; natural and simple. <i>An artless manner.</i>
<u>banal</u>	So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring. <i>Songs with banal repeated words.</i>
<u>brevity</u>	Concise and exact use of words in writing or speech. <i>The staff will edit manuscripts with a view to brevity and clarity.</i>
<u>candor</u>	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
candour	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech. <i>A man of refreshing candour.</i>
<u>clarity</u>	The quality of transparency or purity. <i>When she awoke the clarity was back in her eyes.</i>
conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
designed	Planned or conceived in detail or for a specific purpose. <i>The aircraft performed their designed functions well.</i>
<u>destined</u>	Headed or intending to head in a certain direction; often used as a combining form as in `college-bound students. <i>They were destined to become diplomats.</i>
directness	The quality of proceeding in a straight line without deflection. <i>He was renowned for the clarity and directness of his sermons.</i>
<u>disposed</u>	Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward. <i>He is favourably disposed towards the proposals.</i>
<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>He brought in someone new and eased them into the job.</i>
easiness	Freedom from difficulty or hardship or effort. <i>There was an easiness between them.</i>

easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Her easy and agreeable manner.</i>
fain	In a willing manner. <i>The traveller was fain to proceed.</i>
forthrightness	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
guileless	Devoid of guile; innocent and without deception. <i>His face once so open and guileless.</i>
<u>honesty</u>	A European plant with purple or white flowers and round, flat, translucent seed pods which are used for indoor flower arrangements. <i>I bought potatoes and tomatoes from the roadside stall putting 3 in the honesty box.</i>
inclined	At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position. <i>Wasn't inclined to believe the excuse.</i>
<u>naive</u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>A teenager's naive ignorance of life.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>Helping freshmen become oriented to college life.</i>
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<u>prone</u>	Denoting the position of the forearm with the palm of the hand facing downwards. <i>Farmed fish are prone to disease.</i>
<u>pushover</u>	Someone who is easily taken advantage of. <i>Colonel Moore was benevolent but no pushover.</i>
simplicity	Absence of affectation or pretense. <i>The simplicity of a crystal.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	Free from ambiguity. <i>Straightforward in all his business affairs.</i>
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<u>susceptible</u>	Capable or admitting of. <i>The problem is not susceptible of a simple solution.</i>
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Lacking complexity. <i>An unsophisticated young man.</i>
