| plain | Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>For years he was just plain Bill.</i> |
| processing | Preparing or putting through a prescribed procedure. <i>The processing of newly arrived immigrants.</i> |
| quicken | Give new life or energy to. <i>She quickened her pace desperate to escape.</i> |
| refinery | An industrial plant for purifying a crude substance. <i>An oil refinery.</i> |
| relieve | Relieve oneself of troubling information. <i>She relieved me of the household chores.</i> |
| simple | (of a lens, microscope, etc.) consisting of a single lens or component. <i>Simple mechanisms.</i> |
| simplicity | Lack of ornamentation. <i>They took advantage of her simplicity.</i> |
| simplification | The process of making something simpler or easier to do or understand. <i>He is proposing simplification of the planning system.</i> |
| solidification | The process of becoming hard or solid by cooling or drying or crystallization. |
| <u>straightforward</u> | Pointed directly ahead. <i>A straightforward set of instructions.</i> |
| <u>unambiguous</u> | Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous.</i> |
| <u>unequivocal</u> | Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. <i>The plain and unequivocal language of the laws.</i> |

- univocal** Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.
*A **univocal** set of instructions.*
- unmistakable** Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive.
*The **unmistakable** sound of his laughter.*
