<b>make simpler</b>	Form by assembling individuals or constituents.
<b>remove the complexities from</b>	Remove something concrete, as by lifting, pushing, or taking off, or remove something abstract.
<b>unravel</b>	Disentangle. <i>The sweater <b>unraveled</b>.</i>
<b><u>untangle</u></b>	Free from a tangled or twisted state. <i>Fishermen <b>untangled</b> their nets.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Simplify" as a verb

- *We had to simplify the instructions.*
- *This move will simplify our lives.*

## Associations of "Simplify" (30 Words)

<b><u>accelerate</u></b>	Cause to move faster. <i>He <b>accelerated</b> the car.</i>
<b><u>alleviate</u></b>	Provide physical relief, as from pain. <i>He couldn't prevent her pain only <b>alleviate</b> it.</i>
<b><u>brevity</u></b>	The use of brief expressions. <i>The staff will edit manuscripts with a view to <b>brevity</b> and clarity.</i>
<b><u>clarity</u></b>	The quality of being certain or definite. <i>For the sake of <b>clarity</b> each of these strategies is dealt with separately.</i>
<b><u>clear</u></b>	Grant authorization or clearance for. <i>He had time to get <b>clear</b> away.</i>
<b>decelerate</b>	Reduce or cause to reduce in speed. <i>The car <b>decelerated</b>.</i>
<b>directness</b>	The quality of being plain and straightforward. <i>I like the simplicity and <b>directness</b> of the image.</i>
<b><u>ease</u></b>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>They put it into containers for <b>ease</b> of transportation.</i>
<b>easiness</b>	Freedom from difficulty or hardship or effort. <i>A natural <b>easiness</b> of manner.</i>
<b>expedite</b>	Process fast and efficiently. <i>He promised to <b>expedite</b> economic reforms.</i>

<b>facilitate</b>	Be of use. <i>You could <b>facilitate</b> the process by sharing your knowledge.</i>
<b>hasten</b>	Move hurriedly. <i>This tragedy probably <b>hastened</b> his own death from heart disease.</i>
<b>hie</b>	Move hurriedly. <i>I <b>hied</b> me to a winehouse.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>There s no <b>hurry</b> to get back.</i>
<b>pacify</b>	Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>The U N troops are working to <b>pacify</b> Bosnia.</i>
<b>perspicuous</b>	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more <b>perspicuous</b> explanations than its rivals.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>For years he was just <b>plain</b> Bill.</i>
<b>processing</b>	Preparing or putting through a prescribed procedure. <i>The <b>processing</b> of newly arrived immigrants.</i>
<b>quicken</b>	Give new life or energy to. <i>She <b>quicken</b>ed her pace desperate to escape.</i>
<b>refinery</b>	An industrial plant for purifying a crude substance. <i>An oil <b>refinery</b>.</i>
<b>relieve</b>	Relieve oneself of troubling information. <i>She <b>relieved</b> me of the household chores.</i>
<b>simple</b>	(of a lens, microscope, etc.) consisting of a single lens or component. <i><b>Simple</b> mechanisms.</i>
<b>simplicity</b>	Lack of ornamentation. <i>They took advantage of her <b>simplicity</b>.</i>
<b>simplification</b>	The process of making something simpler or easier to do or understand. <i>He is proposing <b>simplification</b> of the planning system.</i>
<b>solidification</b>	The process of becoming hard or solid by cooling or drying or crystallization.
<u><b>straightforward</b></u>	Pointed directly ahead. <i>A <b>straightforward</b> set of instructions.</i>
<u><b>unambiguous</b></u>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>
<u><b>unequivocal</b></u>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. <i>The plain and <b>unequivocal</b> language of the laws.</i>

**univocal**

Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.

A **univocal** set of instructions.

**unmistakable**

Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive.

The **unmistakable** sound of his laughter.
