## Synonyms of "Simultaneous" as an adjective (12 Words)

**co-occurrent**

Occurring or operating at the same time.

**coincident**

Occurring or operating at the same time.

*A series of **coincident** events.*

**coincidental**

Happening or existing at the same time.

*It s convenient that his plan is **coincidental** with the group s closure.*

**coinciding**

Occurring or operating at the same time.

**concomitant**

Occurring with or following as a consequence.

*She loved travel with all its **concomitant** worries.*

**concurrent**

(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point.

*He received **concurrent** sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.*

<u>contemporaneous</u>	Of the same period. <i>A rise in interest rates is often <b>contemporaneous</b> with an increase in inflation.</i>
cooccurring	Occurring or operating at the same time.
done at the same time	Having finished or arrived at completion.
synchronic	(of taxa) occurring in the same period of geological time. <b>Synchronic</b> linguistics.
<u>synchronized</u>	Operating in unison. <i>The <b>synchronized</b> flapping of a bird s wings.</i>
synchronous	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase- Jour.A.M.A. <i>The <b>synchronous</b> action of a bird s wings in flight.</i>

## Associations of "Simultaneous" (30 Words)

automatically	As a necessary and inevitable result of a fixed rule or particular set of circumstances. <i>The winners of the Division 2 final are not <b>automatically</b> promoted.</i>
coeval	A person of nearly the same age as another. <i>These lavas were <b>coeval</b> with the volcanic activity.</i>
coexisting	Existing at the same time.
<u>coincide</u>	Be the same. <i>The interests of employers and employees do not always <b>coincide</b>.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	A remarkable concurrence of events or circumstances without apparent causal connection. <i>The <b>coincidence</b> of interest between the mining companies and certain politicians.</i>
coincident	Occurring together in space or time. <i>The stake of defence attorneys is not always <b>coincident</b> with that of their clients.</i>
<u>coincidental</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Any resemblance between their reports is purely <b>coincidental</b>.</i>

<b><u>concomitant</u></b>	Naturally accompanying or associated. <i><b>Concomitant</b> with his obsession with dirt was a desire for order.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>He received <b>concurrent</b> sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i>
<b>concurrently</b>	Overlapping in duration. <i>Journal articles published <b>concurrently</b> with the exhibition.</i>
<b><u>congruent</u></b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>The rules may not be <b>congruent</b> with the requirements of the law.</i>
<b><u>contemporaneous</u></b>	Occurring in the same period of time. <i>Pythagoras was <b>contemporaneous</b> with Buddha.</i>
<b><u>contemporary</u></b>	Living or occurring at the same time. <i><b>Contemporary</b> trends in design.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. <i>Every member has clearly defined tasks in a <b>cooperative</b> enterprise.</i>
<b><u>equalize</u></b>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. <i>Let s <b>equalize</b> the duties among all employees in this office.</i>
<b><u>equate</u></b>	Consider (one thing) to be the same as or equivalent to another. <i>That sum <b>equates</b> to half a million pounds today.</i>
<b><u>fortuitous</u></b>	Having no cause or apparent cause. <i>The similarity between the paintings may not be simply <b>fortuitous</b>.</i>
<b>hap</b>	An accidental happening. <i>If you have the good <b>hap</b> to come into their houses.</i>
<b>happenstance</b>	Coincidence. <i>An untoward <b>happenstance</b> for Trudy.</i>
<b><u>identical</u></b>	Expressing an identity. <i>An <b>identical</b> proposition.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i><b>Incidentally</b> it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
<b>occur</b>	Happen; take place. <i>Radon <b>occurs</b> naturally in rocks such as granite.</i>
<b>oscillate</b>	Vary in magnitude or position in a regular manner about a central point. <i>The grain pan near the front of the combine <b>oscillates</b> back and forth.</i>
<b>recent</b>	The Holocene epoch. <i>A <b>recent</b> edition of the newspaper.</i>

<b>same</b>	Similarly in the same way. <i>I have never made the <b>same</b> mistake since.</i>
<b>simultaneously</b>	At the same instant. <i>They spoke <b>simultaneously</b>.</i>
<b><u>sync</u></b>	Make synchronous and adjust in time or manner. <i>Let s <b>sync</b>ronize our efforts.</i>
<b>synchronism</b>	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
<b><u>synchronize</u></b>	Adjust (a clock or watch) to show the same time as another. <i>Both media <b>synchronize</b> national interests with multinational scope.</i>
<b>synchronous</b>	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase. <i><b>Synchronous</b> oscillations.</i>
