co-occurrent	Occurring or operating at the same time.
coincident	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>A series of coincident events.</i>
<u>coincidental</u>	Happening or existing at the same time. <i>It s convenient that his plan is coincidental with the group s closure.</i>
coinciding	Occurring or operating at the same time.
<u>concomitant</u>	Occurring with or following as a consequence. <i>She loved travel with all its concomitant worries.</i>
concurrent	(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point. <i>He received concurrent sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i>

<u>contemporaneous</u>	Of the same period. <i>A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.</i>
cooccurring	Occurring or operating at the same time.
done at the same time	Having finished or arrived at completion.
synchronic	(of taxa) occurring in the same period of geological time. Synchronic linguistics.
<u>synchronized</u>	Operating in unison. <i>The synchronized flapping of a bird s wings.</i>
synchronous	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase- Jour.A.M.A. <i>The synchronous action of a bird s wings in flight.</i>

Associations of "Simultaneous" (30 Words)

automatically	As a necessary and inevitable result of a fixed rule or particular set of circumstances. <i>The winners of the Division 2 final are not automatically promoted.</i>
coeval	A person of nearly the same age as another. <i>These lavas were coeval with the volcanic activity.</i>
coexisting	Existing at the same time.
<u>coincide</u>	Be the same. <i>The interests of employers and employees do not always coincide.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	A remarkable concurrence of events or circumstances without apparent causal connection. <i>The coincidence of interest between the mining companies and certain politicians.</i>
coincident	Occurring together in space or time. <i>The stake of defence attorneys is not always coincident with that of their clients.</i>
<u>coincidental</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Any resemblance between their reports is purely coincidental.</i>

<u>concomitant</u>	Naturally accompanying or associated. <i>Concomitant with his obsession with dirt was a desire for order.</i>
concurrent	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>He received concurrent sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i>
concurrently	Overlapping in duration. <i>Journal articles published concurrently with the exhibition.</i>
<u>congruent</u>	In agreement or harmony. <i>The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.</i>
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Occurring in the same period of time. <i>Pythagoras was contemporaneous with Buddha.</i>
<u>contemporary</u>	Living or occurring at the same time. <i>Contemporary trends in design.</i>
<u>cooperative</u>	An association formed and operated for the benefit of those using it. <i>Every member has clearly defined tasks in a cooperative enterprise.</i>
<u>equalize</u>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. <i>Let s equalize the duties among all employees in this office.</i>
<u>equate</u>	Consider (one thing) to be the same as or equivalent to another. <i>That sum equates to half a million pounds today.</i>
<u>fortuitous</u>	Having no cause or apparent cause. <i>The similarity between the paintings may not be simply fortuitous.</i>
hap	An accidental happening. <i>If you have the good hap to come into their houses.</i>
happenstance	Coincidence. <i>An untoward happenstance for Trudy.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Expressing an identity. <i>An identical proposition.</i>
incidentally	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
occur	Happen; take place. <i>Radon occurs naturally in rocks such as granite.</i>
oscillate	Vary in magnitude or position in a regular manner about a central point. <i>The grain pan near the front of the combine oscillates back and forth.</i>
recent	The Holocene epoch. <i>A recent edition of the newspaper.</i>

same	Similarly in the same way. <i>I have never made the same mistake since.</i>
simultaneously	At the same instant. <i>They spoke simultaneously.</i>
<u>sync</u>	Make synchronous and adjust in time or manner. <i>Let s syncronize our efforts.</i>
synchronism	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
<u>synchronize</u>	Adjust (a clock or watch) to show the same time as another. <i>Both media synchronize national interests with multinational scope.</i>
synchronous	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase. <i>Synchronous oscillations.</i>
