## Associations of "Since then" (30 Words)

<b>after</b>	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Two hours <b>after</b> that.</i>
<b><a href="#">afterward</a></b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until <b>afterward</b>.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	In reverse of the usual direction or order. <i>Penny glanced <b>backwards</b>.</i>
<b>behind</b>	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>Ben led the way with Joe a short distance <b>behind</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">belated</a></b>	Coming or happening later than should have been the case. <i>A <b>belated</b> apology.</i>
<b>by</b>	So as to pass a given point. <i>He let only a moment go <b>by</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">consequently</a></b>	(sentence connectors) because of the reason given. <i>He had good reason to be grateful for the opportunities which they had made available to him and which <b>consequently</b> led to the good position he now held.</i>
<b><a href="#">ensuing</a></b>	Following immediately and as a result of what went before. <i><b>Ensuing</b> events confirmed the prediction.</i>
<b>farther</b>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i><b>Farther</b> down the corridor.</i>
<b>following</b>	Immediately following in time or order. <i>The crowd of <b>following</b> cars made the occasion seem like a parade.</i>
<b>future</b>	Effective in or looking toward the future. <i>I began to believe I might have a <b>future</b> as an artist.</i>

<b>hence</b>	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion hence adv from this place. <i>Two years <b>hence</b> they might say something different.</i>
<b>hereby</b>	(formal) by means of this. <i>All such warranties are <b>hereby</b> excluded.</i>
<b>hitherto</b>	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i><b>Hitherto</b> part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
<b>late</b>	At or toward an end or late period or stage of development. <i>His <b>late</b> arrival.</i>
<b>later</b>	Comparative of the adverb `late. <i>He s going to the store but he ll be back here <b>later</b>.</i>
<b>next</b>	The next person or thing. <i>Building materials were <b>next</b> in importance.</i>
<b>past</b>	A past tense or form of a verb. <i>This <b>past</b> Thursday.</i>
<b>pluperfect</b>	The pluperfect tense. <i>He spoke with <b>pluperfect</b> precision.</i>
<b>posthumous</b>	Occurring or coming into existence after a person's death. <i>A <b>posthumous</b> book.</i>
<b>retrospective</b>	Looking back on or dealing with past events or situations. <i>A <b>retrospective</b> collection of albums spanning the course of his entire career.</i>
<b>shortly</b>	In a concise manner; in a few words. <i>The book will appear <b>shortly</b>.</i>
<b>so</b>	The syllable naming the fifth dominant note of any musical scale in solmization. <i>Never been <b>so</b> happy.</i>
<b>sometime</b>	Former. <i>The <b>sometime</b> editor of the paper.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The work was accepted for inclusion in the Paris Salon of 1880 and was <b>subsequently</b> sold to an important collector.</i>
<b>there</b>	Used when gesturing to indicate the place intended. <i><b>There</b> s a restaurant round the corner.</i>
<b>thereby</b>	By that means or because of that. <i>Students perform in hospitals <b>thereby</b> gaining a deeper awareness of the therapeutic power of music.</i>

**therefore** From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion therefore adv as a consequence.  
*He was injured and **therefore** unable to play.*

**thus** From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion thus adv in the way indicated thusly is a nonstandard variant.  
*She rang up Susan and while she was **thus** engaged Chignell summoned the doctor.*

**timing** The time when something happens.  
*The introduction of new signal **timings**.*
