after	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Two hours after that.</i>
afterward	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until afterward.</i>
backwards	In reverse of the usual direction or order. <i>Penny glanced backwards.</i>
behind	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>Ben led the way with Joe a short distance behind.</i>
belated	Coming or happening later than should have been the case. <i>A belated apology.</i>
by	So as to pass a given point. <i>He let only a moment go by.</i>
consequently	(sentence connectors) because of the reason given. <i>He had good reason to be grateful for the opportunities which they had made available to him and which consequently led to the good position he now held.</i>
ensuing	Following immediately and as a result of what went before. <i>Ensuing events confirmed the prediction.</i>
farther	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Farther down the corridor.</i>
following	Immediately following in time or order. <i>The crowd of following cars made the occasion seem like a parade.</i>
future	Effective in or looking toward the future. <i>I began to believe I might have a future as an artist.</i>

hence	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion hence adv from this place. <i>Two years hence they might say something different.</i>
hereby	(formal) by means of this. <i>All such warranties are hereby excluded.</i>
hitherto	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i>Hitherto part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
late	At or toward an end or late period or stage of development. <i>His late arrival.</i>
later	Comparative of the adverb `late. <i>He s going to the store but he ll be back here later.</i>
next	The next person or thing. <i>Building materials were next in importance.</i>
past	A past tense or form of a verb. <i>This past Thursday.</i>
pluperfect	The pluperfect tense. <i>He spoke with pluperfect precision.</i>
posthumous	Occurring or coming into existence after a person's death. <i>A posthumous book.</i>
retrospective	Looking back on or dealing with past events or situations. <i>A retrospective collection of albums spanning the course of his entire career.</i>
shortly	In a concise manner; in a few words. <i>The book will appear shortly.</i>
so	The syllable naming the fifth dominant note of any musical scale in solmization. <i>Never been so happy.</i>
sometime	Former. <i>The sometime editor of the paper.</i>
subsequently	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The work was accepted for inclusion in the Paris Salon of 1880 and was subsequently sold to an important collector.</i>
there	Used when gesturing to indicate the place intended. <i>There s a restaurant round the corner.</i>
thereby	By that means or because of that. <i>Students perform in hospitals thereby gaining a deeper awareness of the therapeutic power of music.</i>
