Definitions of "Sincere" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “sincere” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Characterized by a firm and humorless belief in the validity of your opinions.*
- *(of a person) saying what they genuinely feel or believe; not dishonest or hypocritical.*
- *Free from pretence or deceit; proceeding from genuine feelings.*
- *Open and genuine; not deceitful.*



Synonyms of "Sincere" as an adjective (15 Words)

candid

Truthful and straightforward; frank.
*I gave them my **candid** opinion.*

deep

Relatively deep or strong affecting one deeply.
*A **deep** analysis.*

direct

Moving from west to east on the celestial sphere or for planets around the sun in the same direction as the Earth.
*A **direct** descendant of the king.*

earnest

Earnest.
*Two girls were in **earnest** conversation.*

frank

Open, honest, and direct in speech or writing, especially when dealing with unpalatable matters.
***Frank** enjoyment.*

<u>genuine</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something. Genuine leather.
heartfelt	(of a feeling or its expression) deeply and strongly felt; sincere. Heartfelt condolences.
<u>honest</u>	Worthy of being depended on. Worked at an honest trade.
meaning what one says	Rich in significance or implication.
profound	Situated at or extending to great depth; too deep to have been sounded or plumbed. The differences are profound .
<u>solemn</u>	Characterized by deep sincerity. The judge was solemn as he pronounced sentence.
<u>straightforward</u>	Free from ambiguity. A straightforward young man.
truthful	Expressing or given to expressing the truth. I think you re confusing being rude with being truthful .
unhypocritical	Free from pretence; sincere. An unhypocritical and honest person.
wholehearted	Showing or characterized by complete sincerity and commitment. You have my wholehearted support.

apology	A formal expression of regret at being unable to attend a meeting or social function. <i>It was an apology for a meal.</i>
artless	Lacking art or knowledge. <i>An artless literary masterpiece.</i>
authenticity	Undisputed credibility. <i>The paper should have established the authenticity of the documents before publishing them.</i>
bluntly	In an uncompromisingly forthright way. <i>A colleague bluntly told him that he had no business asking for the status report.</i>
<u>candid</u>	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>A candid interview.</i>

<u>candor</u>	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
candour	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech. <i>A man of refreshing candour.</i>
directness	The quality of proceeding in a straight line without deflection. <i>I like the simplicity and directness of the image.</i>
downright	Complete and without restriction or qualification; sometimes used informally as intensifiers. <i>Her common sense and downright attitude to life surprised him.</i>
earnest	Earnest. <i>Two girls were in earnest conversation.</i>
forthright	Immediately. <i>Spoke forthright or forthrightly and to the point.</i>
frank	Open, honest, and direct in speech or writing, especially when dealing with unpalatable matters. <i>Kate looked at Sam with frank admiration.</i>
<u>genuine</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something G K Chesterton. <i>Genuine 24 carat gold.</i>
heartfelt	Sincerely earnest. <i>Our heartfelt thanks.</i>
<u>honest</u>	Simple, unpretentious, and unsophisticated. <i>An honest working stiff.</i>
<u>honesty</u>	A European plant with purple or white flowers and round, flat, translucent seed pods which are used for indoor flower arrangements. <i>It was not in all honesty an auspicious debut.</i>
ingenuous	Lacking in sophistication or worldliness. <i>He eyed her with wide ingenuous eyes.</i>
integrity	The state of being whole and undivided. <i>The structural integrity of the novel.</i>
<u>openness</u>	Lack of secrecy or concealment; frankness. <i>The openness of the internet makes public debate more possible.</i>
<u>outspoken</u>	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>It is possible to be outspoken without being rude.</i>
plainspoken	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>A plainspoken country doctor.</i>

<u>seriousness</u>	The trait of being serious. <i>We are aware of the seriousness of the situation.</i>
<u>sincerity</u>	The trait of being serious- Robert Rice. <i>The simple sincerity of folk songs.</i>
straightness	Lack of a tendency to curl.
truthful	Expressing or given to expressing the truth. <i>I think you re confusing being rude with being truthful.</i>
<u>truthfulness</u>	The fact of being true; truth. <i>The truthfulness of her playing of an ageing American spinster.</i>
unpretentious	Not attempting to impress others with an appearance of greater importance, talent, or culture than is actually possessed. <i>An unpretentious country church.</i>
veracious	Habitually speaking the truth. <i>A veracious account.</i>
<u>veracity</u>	Conformity to facts; accuracy. <i>Voters should be concerned about his veracity and character.</i>
wholehearted	Showing or characterized by complete sincerity and commitment. <i>You have my wholehearted support.</i>
