## Associations of "Single out" (30 Words)

<b>alone</b>	Isolated from others. <i>She is <b>alone</b> much of the time.</i>
<b><u>apart</u></b>	No longer living together or close emotionally. <i>Two stone gateposts some thirty feet <b>apart</b>.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Aloof and objective. <i><b>Detached</b> houses.</i>
<b><u>forlorn</u></b>	Marked by or showing hopelessness. <i><b>Forlorn</b> figures at bus stops.</i>
<b><u>hermit</u></b>	A hummingbird found in the shady lower layers of tropical forests, foraging along a regular route.
<b>homesick</b>	Experiencing a longing for one’s home during a period of absence from it. <i>He was <b>homesick</b> for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>
<b>isolate</b>	A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>The best way to <b>isolate</b> sick fish is to set up a hospital tank.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Single; exceptional. <i><b>Isolated</b> instances of rebellion.</i>
<b><u>isolation</u></b>	Denoting a hospital or ward for patients with infectious diseases. <i>He opposed a policy of American <b>isolation</b>.</i>
<b><u>lone</u></b>	(of a place) unfrequented and remote. <i>I approached a <b>lone</b> drinker across the bar.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Lacking companions or companionship. <i>A <b>lonely</b> country lane.</i>
<b>lonesome</b>	Marked by dejection from being alone. <i>A <b>lonesome</b> pine.</i>
<b><u>outsider</u></b>	A person who is not accepted by or who isolates themselves from society. <i>She felt that his friends despised her as an <b>outsider</b>.</i>

<b>privacy</b>	The state of being free from public attention. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people s <b>privacy</b>.</i>
<b>recluse</b>	One who lives in solitude. <i>He s a bit of a <b>recluse</b>.</i>
<b>remote</b>	A remote control device. <i><b>Remote</b> stars.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep (someone) away from other people. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b>secluded</b>	Hidden from general view or use. <i>The gardens are quiet and <b>secluded</b>.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	The act of secluding yourself from others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>separated</b> shoulder.</i>
<b>sequester</b>	Requisition forcibly, as of enemy property. <i>He <b>sequestered</b> himself in his study to write a book.</i>
<b>sole</b>	Put a new sole on to a shoe. <i>A big blister on each heel and <b>sole</b>.</i>
<b>solitary</b>	(of a flower or other part) borne singly. <i>A <b>solitary</b> traveler.</i>
<b>times</b>	An arithmetic operation that is the inverse of division; the product of two numbers is computed. <i>You <b>times</b> the six by four to get twenty four.</i>
<b>troglydte</b>	One who lives in solitude.
<b>unappreciated</b>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b>uniquely</b>	So as to be unique. <i><b>Uniquely</b> shaped buildings.</i>
<b>unrewarding</b>	Not rewarding or satisfying. <i>It was dull <b>unrewarding</b> work.</i>
<b>unshared</b>	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Harvey is one of the <b>unsung</b> heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
