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Associations of "Sinister antonym" (30 Words)

alphabet	The elementary stages of any subject (usually plural). <i>A phonetic alphabet.</i>
augury	An event that is experienced as indicating important things to come. <i>They heard the sound as an augury of death.</i>
baleful	Deadly or sinister. <i>The Florida eagles have a fierce baleful look.</i>
baneful	Harmful or destructive. <i>The baneful effects of envy and jealousy.</i>
boding	A feeling of evil to come. <i>A steadily escalating sense of foreboding.</i>
etymology	The study of the sources and development of words. <i>The etymology of the word devil.</i>
forbidding	Harshly uninviting or formidable in manner or appearance. <i>Forbidding thunderclouds.</i>
foreboding	A feeling of evil to come. <i>When the Doctor spoke his voice was dark and foreboding.</i>
grammar	A grammar school. <i>Chomskyan grammar.</i>
grammarian	A person who studies and writes about grammar.
inauspicious	Not auspicious; boding ill. <i>Following this inauspicious start the British outnumbered withdrew.</i>
menacing	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. <i>Our officers encountered menacing looks from teenagers.</i>
minatory	Expressing or conveying a threat. <i>He is unlikely to be deterred by minatory finger wagging.</i>
nefarious	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. <i>The nefarious activities of the organized crime syndicates.</i>

omen	Indicate as with a sign or an omen. <i>The ghost's appearance was an ill omen.</i>
ominous	Presaging ill fortune. <i>There were ominous dark clouds gathering overhead.</i>
orthography	The conventional spelling system of a language. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned orthography.</i>
<u>parse</u>	An act of parsing a string or a text. <i>A user question input is parsed into an internal conceptual representation.</i>
portent	A sign of something about to happen. <i>Many birds are regarded as being portents of death.</i>
presentiment	An intuitive feeling about the future, especially one of foreboding. <i>The lawyer had a presentiment that the judge would dismiss the case.</i>
<u>spelling</u>	A person's ability to spell words. <i>The books and spelling in my class were too simple.</i>
<u>syntax</u>	The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax. <i>The syntax of English.</i>
threatening	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>Her mother had received a threatening letter.</i>
typo	A typographical error.
<u>unpleasant</u>	(of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude. <i>The symptoms are extremely unpleasant.</i>
unpropitious	(of a circumstance) not giving or indicating a good chance of success; unfavourable. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially unpropitious time.</i>
villainous	Extremely bad or unpleasant. <i>A villainous smell.</i>
vocabulary	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>He had a wide vocabulary.</i>
vowel	A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.
wicked	Having committed unrighteous acts. <i>A wicked and unscrupulous politician.</i>
