inauspicious Not auspicious; boding ill.

Following this **inauspicious** start the British outnumbered withdrew.

Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening.

Our officers encountered **menacing** looks from teenagers.

minatory Expressing or conveying a threat.

He is unlikely to be deterred by **minatory** finger wagging.

nefarious (typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal.

The **nefarious** activities of the organized crime syndicates.



omen Indicate as with a sign or an omen.

The ghost s appearance was an ill **omen**.

ominous Presaging ill fortune.

There were **ominous** dark clouds gathering overhead.

orthography The conventional spelling system of a language.

A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned **orthography**.

An act of parsing a string or a text.

A user question input is **parse**d into an internal conceptual representation.

portent A sign of something about to happen.

Many birds are regarded as being **portent**s of death.

presentiment An intuitive feeling about the future, especially one of foreboding.

The lawyer had a **presentiment** that the judge would dismiss the case.

A person's ability to spell words.

The books and **spelling** in my class were too simple.

The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax.

The **syntax** of English.

threatening Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments.

Her mother had received a **threatening** letter.

typo A typographical error.

unpleasant (of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude.

The symptoms are extremely **unpleasant**.

(of a circumstance) not giving or indicating a good chance of success;

unpropitious unfavourable.

His reports were submitted at a financially **unpropitious** time.

Extremely bad or unpleasant.

villainous A villainous smell.

vocabulary A language user's knowledge of words.

He had a wide **vocabulary**.

vowel A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.

wicked Having committed unrighteous acts.

A wicked and unscrupulous politician.
