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• Associations of "Sinister antonym" (30 Words)

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alphabet	The elementary stages of any subject (usually plural. <i>A phonetic alphabet</i> .
<u>augury</u>	An event that is experienced as indicating important things to come. They heard the sound as an <b>augury</b> of death.
baleful	Deadly or sinister. The Florida eagles have a fierce <b>baleful</b> look.
baneful	Harmful or destructive. The <b>baneful</b> effects of envy and jealousy.
boding	A feeling of evil to come. A steadily escalating sense of fore <b>boding</b> .
etymology	The study of the sources and development of words. The <b>etymology</b> of the word devil.
forbidding	Harshly uninviting or formidable in manner or appearance. <i>Forbidding</i> thunderclouds.
<u>foreboding</u>	A feeling of evil to come. When the Doctor spoke his voice was dark and <b>foreboding</b> .
grammar	A grammar school. <i>Chomskyan <b>grammar</b>.</i>
grammarian	A person who studies and writes about grammar.
inauspicious	Not auspicious; boding ill. Following this <b>inauspicious</b> start the British outnumbered withdrew.
<u>menacing</u>	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. Our officers encountered <b>menacing</b> looks from teenagers.
minatory	Expressing or conveying a threat. <i>He is unlikely to be deterred by <b>minatory</b> finger wagging.</i>
nefarious	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. The <b>nefarious</b> activities of the organized crime syndicates.



omen	Indicate as with a sign or an omen. The ghost s appearance was an ill <b>omen</b> .
ominous	Presaging ill fortune. There were <b>ominous</b> dark clouds gathering overhead.
orthography	The conventional spelling system of a language. A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned <b>orthography</b> .
<u>parse</u>	An act of parsing a string or a text. A user question input is <b>parse</b> d into an internal conceptual representation.
portent	A sign of something about to happen. Many birds are regarded as being <b>portent</b> s of death.
presentiment	An intuitive feeling about the future, especially one of foreboding. The lawyer had a <b>presentiment</b> that the judge would dismiss the case.
<u>spelling</u>	A person's ability to spell words. The books and <b>spelling</b> in my class were too simple.
<u>syntax</u>	The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax. The <b>syntax</b> of English.
threatening	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>Her mother had received a <b>threatening</b> letter.</i>
typo	A typographical error.
<u>unpleasant</u>	(of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude. <i>The symptoms are extremely</i> <b>unpleasant</b> .
unpropitious	(of a circumstance) not giving or indicating a good chance of success; unfavourable. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially</i> <b>unpropitious</b> <i>time.</i>
villainous	Extremely bad or unpleasant. A <b>villainous</b> smell.
vocabulary	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>He had a wide <b>vocabulary</b>.</i>
vowel	A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.
wicked	Having committed unrighteous acts. A <b>wicked</b> and unscrupulous politician.
