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## Associations of "Sinister antonym" (30 Words)

<b>alphabet</b>	The elementary stages of any subject (usually plural). <i>A phonetic <b>alphabet</b>.</i>
<a href="#">augury</a>	An event that is experienced as indicating important things to come. <i>They heard the sound as an <b>augury</b> of death.</i>
<b>baleful</b>	Deadly or sinister. <i>The Florida eagles have a fierce <b>baleful</b> look.</i>
<b>baneful</b>	Harmful or destructive. <i>The <b>baneful</b> effects of envy and jealousy.</i>
<b>boding</b>	A feeling of evil to come. <i>A steadily escalating sense of <b>foreboding</b>.</i>
<b>etymology</b>	The study of the sources and development of words. <i>The <b>etymology</b> of the word devil.</i>
<b>forbidding</b>	Harshly uninviting or formidable in manner or appearance. <i><b>Forbidding</b> thunderclouds.</i>
<a href="#">foreboding</a>	A feeling of evil to come. <i>When the Doctor spoke his voice was dark and <b>foreboding</b>.</i>
<b>grammar</b>	A grammar school. <i>Chomskyan <b>grammar</b>.</i>
<b>grammarian</b>	A person who studies and writes about grammar.
<b>inauspicious</b>	Not auspicious; boding ill. <i>Following this <b>inauspicious</b> start the British outnumbered withdrew.</i>
<a href="#">menacing</a>	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. <i>Our officers encountered <b>menacing</b> looks from teenagers.</i>
<b>minatory</b>	Expressing or conveying a threat. <i>He is unlikely to be deterred by <b>minatory</b> finger wagging.</i>
<b>nefarious</b>	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. <i>The <b>nefarious</b> activities of the organized crime syndicates.</i>

<b>omen</b>	Indicate as with a sign or an omen. <i>The ghost's appearance was an ill <b>omen</b>.</i>
<b>ominous</b>	Presaging ill fortune. <i>There were <b>ominous</b> dark clouds gathering overhead.</i>
<b>orthography</b>	The conventional spelling system of a language. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned <b>orthography</b>.</i>
<b><u>parse</u></b>	An act of parsing a string or a text. <i>A user question input is <b>parsed</b> into an internal conceptual representation.</i>
<b>portent</b>	A sign of something about to happen. <i>Many birds are regarded as being <b>portents</b> of death.</i>
<b>presentiment</b>	An intuitive feeling about the future, especially one of foreboding. <i>The lawyer had a <b>presentiment</b> that the judge would dismiss the case.</i>
<b><u>spelling</u></b>	A person's ability to spell words. <i>The books and <b>spelling</b> in my class were too simple.</i>
<b><u>syntax</u></b>	The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax. <i>The <b>syntax</b> of English.</i>
<b>threatening</b>	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>Her mother had received a <b>threatening</b> letter.</i>
<b>typo</b>	A typographical error.
<b><u>unpleasant</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude. <i>The symptoms are extremely <b>unpleasant</b>.</i>
<b>unpropitious</b>	(of a circumstance) not giving or indicating a good chance of success; unfavourable. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially <b>unpropitious</b> time.</i>
<b>villainous</b>	Extremely bad or unpleasant. <i>A <b>villainous</b> smell.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>He had a wide <b>vocabulary</b>.</i>
<b>vowel</b>	A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.
<b>wicked</b>	Having committed unrighteous acts. <i>A <b>wicked</b> and unscrupulous politician.</i>
