## Sinner as a Noun

### Definitions of "Sinner" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “sinner” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person who transgresses against divine law by committing an immoral act or acts.*
- *A person who sins (without repenting).*



## Synonyms of "Sinner" as a noun (5 Words)

<b>criminal</b>	Someone who has committed a crime or has been legally convicted of a crime. <i>These men are dangerous <b>criminals</b>.</i>
<b>evildoer</b>	A person who commits profoundly immoral and wicked deeds. <i>His concept of justice demanded vengeance against <b>evildoers</b>.</i>
<b>offender</b>	A person or thing that does something wrong or causes problems. <i>An institution for young <b>offenders</b>.</i>
<b>transgressor</b>	Someone who transgresses; someone who violates a law or command. <i>The way of <b>transgressors</b> is hard.</i>
<b>wrongdoer</b>	A person who behaves illegally or dishonestly; an offender. <i>They need to punish <b>wrongdoers</b>.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Sinner" as a noun

- *God forgives repentant sinners.*





## Associations of "Sinner" (30 Words)

**apologetic**      Constituting a formal defence or justification of a theory or doctrine.  
An ***apologetic*** manner.

**atone**              Turn away from sin or do penitence.  
A human sacrifice to ***atone*** for the sin.

**atonement**        The reconciliation of God and mankind through Jesus Christ.  
He submitted his resignation as an act of ***atonement***.

**compunction**      A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed).  
They used their tanks without ***compunction***.

**confess**            Of a priest listen to the confession of.  
I could not ***confess*** all my sins to the priest.

**confession**        The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith.  
He signed a ***confession*** to both the murders.

<b>confessor</b>	A person who makes a confession. <i>She sent for her <b>confessor</b> because she was in mortal sin.</i>
<b>contrite</b>	Feeling or expressing remorse at the recognition that one has done wrong. <i>A <b>contrite</b> tone.</i>
<b>contrition</b>	Sorrow for sin arising from fear of damnation. <i>To show <b>contrition</b> for his crime he offered to do community service.</i>
<u><b>convict</b></u>	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. <i>The thieves were <b>convicted</b> of the robbery.</i>
<u><b>culprit</b></u>	Someone who perpetrates wrongdoing. <i>The car's front nearside door had been smashed in but the <b>culprits</b> had fled.</i>
<b>expiate</b>	Make amends for. <i>Their sins must be <b>expiated</b> by sacrifice.</i>
<b>forgive</b>	Stop blaming or grant forgiveness. <i>I'll never <b>forgive</b> David for the way he treated her.</i>
<b>guilty</b>	Culpable of or responsible for a specified wrongdoing. <i>He was found <b>guilty</b> of manslaughter.</i>
<b>impenitent</b>	Not penitent or remorseful. <i><b>Impenitent</b> elitists.</i>
<b>penance</b>	Impose a penance on. <i>He had done public <b>penance</b> for those hasty words.</i>
<b>penitence</b>	The action of feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong; repentance. <i>A public display of <b>penitence</b>.</i>
<b>penitent</b>	A person who repents their sins and (in the Christian Church) seeks forgiveness from God. <i>A <b>penitent</b> expression.</i>
<b>penitential</b>	Showing or constituting penance. <i>Wrote a <b>penitential</b> letter apologizing for her hasty words.</i>
<b>regret</b>	Express with regret. <i>I always <b>regretted</b> that I never trained.</i>
<b>regretful</b>	Feeling or showing regret. <i>He sounded <b>regretful</b> but pointed out that he had committed himself.</i>
<u><b>remorse</b></u>	A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed). <i>They were filled with <b>remorse</b> and shame.</i>
<b>remorseful</b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>The defendant was <b>remorseful</b> for what he had done.</i>

<b>repent</b>	Feel remorse for; feel sorry for; be contrite about. <i>I <b>repent</b> me of all I did.</i>
<b>repentance</b>	Remorse for your past conduct. <i>Each person who turns to God in genuine <b>repentance</b> and faith will be saved.</i>
<b>repentant</b>	Expressing or feeling sincere regret and remorse; remorseful. <i>He is truly <b>repentant</b> for his incredible naivety and stupidity.</i>
<b>rue</b>	European strong-scented perennial herb with grey-green bitter-tasting leaves; an irritant similar to poison ivy. <i>She might live to <b>rue</b> this impetuous decision.</i>
<b>rueful</b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>She gave a <b>rueful</b> grin.</i>
<b>scruple</b>	Raise scruples. <i>The man <b>scrupled</b> to perjure himself.</i>
<b>unrepentant</b>	Not penitent or remorseful. <i>He was <b>unrepentant</b> and said that his comments were completely accurate.</i>
